This case was tabled at the September 23, 2021 meeting to allow staff to work with the licensee to voluntarily seek an evaluation for substance abuse disorder and participate in an informal conference.

MOTION: The Committee recommends resolving case 21-168 by issuing a letter of guidance citing Maine EMS Rules chapter 11 §1 (7) "Responding to the scene of a call while under the influence of drugs or alcohol, whether or not the use of such substances is habitual", encouraging the use of support systems and being conscientious about responding to calls following any use of alcohol or other intoxicating substances. This will remain on file for four (4) years. (Gerrish, seconded by Conley; passed)

2. Informal Review (Melissa) – Case 21-182

Summary 21-182: A patient complaint that a licensed service failed to take any improvement measures when notified that a crew dropped the patient.

3. Informal Review (Melissa) – Case 21-193

Summary 21-193: A licensee allegedly abandoned a patient and failed to complete a patient care report.

MOTION: The Committee recommends resolving case 21-193 by issuing a letter of guidance citing Maine EMS Rules chapter 11 §1 (14) "Violation of any standard established in the profession" for not documenting a patient refusal and Chapter 5 §4. Requiring the licensee who provided primary patient care to enter an electronic patient care report within 24 hours. This will remain on file through April 30, 2025. (Conley, seconded by Drinkwater; passed)

4. Informal Review (Griffin) – Case 21-184

Summary 21-184: A licensed service failed to maintain required equipment and medications.

MOTION: The Committee recommends resolving case 21-184 by offering a consent agreement citing violation of Maine EMS Rules chapter 3 §14 (1) for a probationary period of six (6) months with terms that include a \$2,500 fine for each failed inspection, for a total of \$5,000; a requirement for 100% QA/QI review of each reqest for service to ensure an ePCR is entered, documentation is appropriate, and adequate care is provided; QA/QI must be contracted with a third party pre-approved by the EMS Office; requiring a comprehensive review of service operations by a third party with experience in such reviews; the reviewer must be pre-approved by the EMS Office; a detailed plan of how the service will address any deficiencies and/or make suggested improvements noted in the operations review; the service's license renewal may be issued upon successful completion of all terms of probation. (Beals, seconded by Kellner; passed)

5. Informal Review (Griffin) – Case 21-187

Summary 21-187: A licensee has demonstrated incompetent practice in failing to acknowledge contaminated equipment generally used for an invasive procedure and made inaccurate statements regarding their response to calls for service.

MOTION: The Committee recommends resolving case 21-187 by issuing a letter of guidance encouraging the licensee to either downgrade their licensee to a level in which they feel comfortable providing care on all calls or to seek training to improve skills to a point in which they feel comfortable responding to all calls at their current license level; and to be mindful of providing accurate statements. This will remain on file for a period of two licensing cycles. (Conley, seconded by Kellner; passed) Roll call vote:

6. Informal Review (Griffin) – Case 21-169

Summary 21-169: A licensee allegedly assaulted a patient. This case was continued at the August meeting to allow staff to obtain records from the fire department regarding any investigation or actions taken regarding this incident with the licensee including the use of a subpoena, if necessary.

7. Informal Review (Griffin) – Case 21-202

Summary 21-202: Non-compliance with a consent agreement from case 20-124.

MOTION: The Committee recommends setting a firm deadline (such as November 30, 2021) for the licensee to come into compliance with the terms of the consent agreement requiring the licensee to identify a third party QA reviewer and have the reviewer preapproved by the Maine EMS Office; and, if the licensee does not comply, then the staff is authorized to issue a preliminary license denial on the licensee's renewal.
