"Certificate of Immunization" means documentation from a health official of the administration of an immunization, specifying the vaccine administered and the 10 date it was administered. Electronic health records, having been compiled and 11 maintained as an official document based on certificates of immunization, which 12 provide at a minimum the month and year that the immunization was 13 administered may also be accepted as proof of immunization. 14 15 2. "Covered Emergency Medical Services Person" means an advanced emergency 16 17 medical services person, a basic emergency medical services person or any person licensed by this board who routinely provides Direct Patient Care. For the 18 purposes of this definition, EMS students that provide Direct Patient Care are 19 Covered Emergency Medical Services Persons. Licensed Ambulance Operators 20 are not considered Covered Emergency Medical Services Persons. 21 22 3. "Direct Patient Care" means any activity that places an individual within 6 feet of 23 a patient for a period of 15 minutes or more. 24 25 26 4. "Disease" means the following conditions which may be preventable by immunization: 27 28 1.Influenza 29 30 31 5. "Effective Date" means November 1, 2023, for Influenza. 32 33 6. "Entity" means an organization which holds a license issued by the Board that 34 authorizes it as an organization to provide emergency medical services, or a 35 training center licensed by the Board. 36 37 7. "Medical Exemption" means a formal procedure to procure discharge from the 38 requirement to vaccinate under this rule in accordance with Section 3 below. 39 40 8. "Immunization" means a vaccine, antitoxin or other substance used to increase an 41 42 individual's immunity to Disease. 43 44 9. "Masking Agreement" means a signed voluntary agreement between an Entity and a Covered Emergency Medical Services Person, obligating the Covered 45 Emergency Medical Services Person to wear at minimum a procedural/surgical 46

mask while providing direct patient care during the months of October through May. This agreement expires annually on November 1.

## §2. Immunization Required

1. Each Entity with which a Covered Emergency Medical Services Person is associated must require that the Covered Emergency Medical Services Person provide to the Entity a Certificate of Immunization or documentation of an Exemption pertaining to the Diseases enumerated in the Chapter. Covered Emergency Medical Services Persons may refuse seasonal immunization for influenza; however, the Entity must obtain and maintain a Masking Agreement in lieu of a valid Certificate of Immunization.

2. No Entity may permit a Covered Emergency Medical Services Person to provide Direct Patient Care without a valid Certificate of Immunization,documentation of an Exemption, or a Masking Agreement. The Seasonal Influenza vaccine is required annually, or as otherwise recommended by the US Centers for Disease Control.

3. Any such immunization must meet the standards for biological products which are approved by the United States Public Health Service.

## §3. Exemptions

1. A Medical Exemption is available to a Covered Emergency Medical Services Person who provides a written statement from a licensed physician, nurse practitioner or physician assistant that, in the clinician's professional judgment, immunization against a disease enumerated in this chapter may be medically inadvisable. To be valid, Medical Exemptions must originate from a physician, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant with whom the Covered Emergency Medical Services Person has an established patient- provider relationship with the clinician issuing the written statement. An exemption is considered permanent unless otherwise denoted in the exemption from the authorized healthcare professional.

2. A Covered Emergency Medical Services Person without a Certificate of Immunization but in possession of a Medical Exemption may provide direct patient care. The Covered Emergency Medical Services Person must complete a Masking Agreement and comply with Section 4 of this chapter to provide direct patient care.

## Masking 92 **§4.** 93 1. Covered Emergency Medical Services Persons who refuse immunization for 94 95 influenza or have a Medical Exemption for influenza vaccination are required to wear, at minimum, a procedural/surgical mask as specified in the Masking 96 Agreement 97 98 2. An Entity must obtain and maintain a Masking Agreement for those associated 99 Covered Emergency Medical Services Persons who are required to wear a mask, 100 prior to allowing those persons to provide direct patient care on their behalf. 101 102 3. Failure of an Entity to ensure that an associated Covered Emergency Medical 103 Services Person complies with this section is considered unprofessional conduct, 104 subject to disciplinary action by the Board. 105 106 4. Failure of a Covered Emergency Medical Services person to comply with this 107 section and/or abide by their Masking Agreement is considered unprofessional 108 conduct subject to disciplinary action by the Board. 109 110 **§5.** Record Keeping 111 112 1. Prior to January 1, 2025, an Entity must keep a record of the immunization status 113 of each Covered Emergency Medical Services Person associated with the Entity. 114 The record must include, at a minimum, the month and year that each 115 immunization dose was administered. 116 117 2. Prior to January 1, 2025, where an Exemption has been granted to a Covered 118 Emergency Medical Services Person, the Entity must maintain the written 119 documentation of the Exemption on file. 120 121 122 3. Prior to January 1, 2025, where a masking agreement has been executed in lieu of a Medical Exemption or a valid Certificate of Immunization, the Entity must 123 maintain written documentation of the executed Masking Agreement. 124 125 126 4. Prior to January 1, 2025, each Entity must maintain a listing of the names of all 127 Covered Emergency Medical Services Person associated with the Entity who are 128 not currently immunized against the diseases enumerated in the Chapter. The list 129 must also include the names of all Covered Emergency Medical Services Persons 130 with Exemptions. 131 132 133 5. After January 1, 2025, An Entity must ensure a record of the immunization status of each Covered Emergency Medical Services Person associated with the Entity 134 through the system prescribed by the Office of Emergency Medical Services. 135 136

137 138		6. After January 1, 2025, Entities must review submissions made by Covered Emergency Medical Services Persons associated with their Entity in the system
139		and attest to valid documentation of Certificate(s) of Immunization, Medical
140		Exemption, and/or a Masking Agreement.
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142		7. All records required under this chapter shall be deemed, for the purposes of public
143		access, confidential medical records under 22 M.R.S. §1711-C. Notwithstanding
144		this statement, the Board may obtain and disclose records required under this
145		chapter in accordance with 32 M.R.S. § 91-B.
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147	<b>§6.</b>	Required Reports
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149		1. Periodic Reporting
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151		Prior to January 1, 2025, each Entity must, on an annual basis, submit a summary
152		report on the immunization status of all Covered Emergency Medical Services
153		Persons associated with the Entity on a form prescribed by Maine EMS no later
154		than November 30 <sup>th</sup> of that year as part of the EMS service license renewal. The
155		summary report will include the following information at a minimum: specific
156		contact information identifying the Entity, the total number of Covered
157		Emergency Medical Services Persons who are immunized, the total number of
158		Covered Emergency Medical Services Persons who possess Exemptions, and the
159		total number of Covered Emergency Medical Services Persons who do not
160		possess a Certificate of Immunization, Exemption, or a Masking Agreement. Each
161		report must be signed by a representative of the Entity as a certification that the
162		information is accurate.
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
