 - a. Kaplan Application Review

Summary: The applicant for a new Ambulance Operator license was previously denied an EMT license.

b. Grant Application Review

Summary: The applicant for a new Ambulance Operator license failed to disclose Class D & E criminal convictions in 2014.

c. Richter Application Review

Summary: The applicant for a new Ambulance Operator license disclosed a conviction for Class D Sexual Assault in 1990.

The account will be flagged by staff to bring any application for clinical licensure to the Board. (Turcotte, Gerrish)

d. 23-271 Case Review

Summary: A licensed EMS Service allegedly permitted paramedic staff to transport mechanically ventilated patients without hospital staff authorized by the sending facility, which may exceed the scope of practice for the paramedic or the expanded scope allowed by the paramedic inter-facility transfer (PIFT) program.

Discussion: The conduct was likely approved in 2003, the service has been transparent about its program since its inception, and the MDPB publicly supported it in documented meeting minutes in 2013. No patient harm has occurred as a result of the program. The service self-reported the potential discrepancy in practice with the Board's resolution of authority after the February 2023 Board meeting, and the Board and MDPB have since taken steps to resolve any potential violations by requiring the service to initiate a pilot project, and the service has been a willing participant in that process.
