1) Introductions/Call to Order

a. Quorum present, meeting begins at 0900

2) Maine EMS Mission Statement is read by Koplovsky

"The mission of Maine EMS is to promote and provide for a comprehensive and effective Emergency Medical Services system to ensure optimum patient care with standards for all clinicians. All members of this board should strive to promote the core values of excellence, support, collaboration, and integrity. In serving on this board, we commit to serve the respective clinicians, communities, and residents of the jurisdictions that we represent."

- 3) Public Comment
 - a. No public comments were made
- 4) Approval of previous minutes
 - a. Motion to approve September 11, 2024 minutes made by Froman and seconded by Russell. No changes. Passes unanimously.
- 5) Changes to agenda

- 6) State Update
 - a. Minkler provides update on posting of Education Coordinator applications received, and HR is scheduling interviews. Maine EMS completed hearings on Chapter 27 proposed rules, comments accepted until October 15 via US mail and electronically. Board will review all comments and use current process for next steps. Connectivity project ended last month, 300 Maine EMS vehicles equipped, and data plan for 3 years funded. Looking at possible funding for after the first 3 years. Maine EMS is working with Image Trend and physicians to discuss artificial intelligence (AI) EMS reports. Image Trend is developing a program called Hero Assist, Maine EMS is offering to be a beta site for testing, and to evaluate benefits and risks. Minkler is going to NREMT next week as a Northeast State EMS Official rep for a task force meeting on testing.

- a. Representative to new Transfer & Transport Committee Motion by Froman to recommend to Board for Gagnon to fill this role, 2nd by Lebrun. No discussion, unanimously approved.
- b. IC License Discussion
 - i. Survey
