

GenUS Learning Exchange Guide



This document is intended to help Mentors and Instructors guide their Learners through the ELO: EMS ConnectME course hosted by JMG on the GenUS Learning Exchange. Individual lessons, assignments, and activities in the Learning Exchange are referred to as "elements."

Definitions:

- **Mentor:** The Mentor is an EMS clinician, or member of the EMS agency, who is serving as the Learner's core role model and supervisor for in-person activities.
- **Instructor:** The Instructor is a JMG Specialist, ELO Coordinator, teacher, guidance counselor, or other school staff who is serving as the primary instructor of record in the Learning Exchange.

Course Overview:

ELO: EMS ConnectME is sequential; each section must be completed and approved/graded by the Instructor before the Learner can move on to the next one. For some in-person activities, the Mentor must assist with providing documentation of the Learner's participation.

Below is a list of course sections, with the general responsibilities of Instructors and Mentors indicated. See the rest of this document for detailed instructions about each element.

- **Level 1: Part 1** = Instructor-led. Guided and graded by the Instructor. At this stage, the Learner has usually not yet made contact with the EMS agency.
- Level 1: Part 2 = Co-led by Instructor and Mentor. Activities are coordinated by the Mentor, with assignments submitted by the Learner that the Instructor grades. Both Mentor and Instructor assist in guiding the Learner through the elements, including obtaining CPR training.
- Next Steps = Co-led by Instructor and Mentor. Both discuss the Learner's future goals, and assist them as needed in deciding whether or not to begin working toward Level 2. The Learner indicates their decision in the GenUS Learning Exchange, and the Instructor approves it.
- Level 2: Part 1 = Mentor-led. The Mentor focuses on teaching the Learner ambulance/equipment competency. The Instructor assists the Learner as needed to complete online modules. Both assist the Learner in obtaining First-Aid/Stop-the-Bleed training.
- **Level 2: Part 2** = Co-led by Instructor and Mentor. Both assist the Learner with their Level 2 Application. This application is submitted to both the GenUS Learning Exchange **AND** the EMS agency. The service interviews the Learner, decides whether or not to approve them for Level 2, and then communicates that with the Instructor. Only with their sign-off does the Instructor approve the Learner to advance in the GenUS Learning Exchange to the next section.
- <u>Level 2: Part 3</u> = Co-led by Instructor and Mentor. The Mentor brings the Learner on EMS calls, and assists them with assignments and reflections afterwards. Both Instructor and Mentor ensure that the Learner has appropriate resources to process any EMS calls that they go on.
