- 6. Director's Report
 - a. Legislative Update

LD-5 This bill has passed and is effective immediately. This bill requires emergency rulemaking which the Office has started drafting. We will bring it to the Rules Committee for consideration once we have completed them.

LD-29 An Act to establish a council on health system development. It will be a PFR bill and we are requesting that someone from DPS/EMS sit on the Council.

LD-797 An act to create a registry to improve access to AED's. This will require a statewide registry for AED's; this would be maintained by MEMS. There will be additional rulemaking around this bill if it passes.

LD-835 An act to allow citizens to petition government agencies to repeal or modify occupational regulations. We are currently monitoring this bill

LD-891 An act to eliminate or forgive fines and penalties for persons and for businesses due to the pandemic. We are also monitoring this bill

LD-942 An act to waive professional and occupational licensing fees for 2020. This would have a dramatic effect on our budget due to the fact that, if this passes, we would have to refund any service and license fees over the past year.

LD-1258 An act to increase access to transportation for workforce and other essential transportation needs. MEMS will not be testifying for or against this bill, but we will be recommending changes.

LD-1290 An act to amend the purpose statement of MEMS; we will not be testifying for or against this bill.

LD-1327 An act to create a Maine healthcare payment loan program; we are monitoring this bill

LD-612 An act to recognize reciprocity for licensure received out of state. Every licensing Board is testifying against this and we will be closely monitoring this bill.

LD-1333 An act concerning the dispensation of naloxone hydrochloride by EMS providers. The sponsor will be updating the language to allow EMS to dispense the medication. The language was originally drafted incorrectly.

Director Hurley states that vaccinations are going well. Maine EMS has helped to facilitate roster billing. The Superintendent of insurance has chosen our roster billing method as the statewide process.

We continue to work with the University of Maine to identify a central IRB t standardize the process for healthcare research across the State.

Committee Updates

EMS-C Marc Minkler EMS-C committee has not met since the last meeting, we will be scheduling a meeting towards the end of May.

The Committee is finishing up some perinatal transport work has be in the works for the last year. The report with recommendations will be presented to MEMS once it is ready.

We have released a program on BRUE that will be available on MEMSEd.

- 7. Medical Director report
 - a. MDPB

A small group of MDPB members continues to meet around the Jackman project. The next steps include identifying reporting metrics. Once completed, this information will come to the Board for consideration.

We are coming to the end of our protocol process. We are working on white papers and supporting materials for the Education Committee to review.

The MDPB has a virtual retreat scheduled for Friday April 23rd. We will be introducing the new members that we've acquired over the last year and working to orient them to the processes and the structure of MDPB. We will also be discussing system issues and identifying goals.

Case 20-153 Summary: An EMD center allowed the unlicensed practice of emergency medical dispatch by an employee for a period of 8 days, during which they processed 2 EMD calls, the center was unable to review those calls for quality assurance because of an equipment error with their recording system. The EMD was eligible for licensure and had submitted an application in a timely manner but the EMD center failed to verify the licensee's employment for almost a month which delayed the processing of the application. As a note, this verification process has been eliminated in the recent MEMS rules change. During the investigation of this incident, the EMD Center was also going through their bi-annual renewal process and the office discovered significant deficiencies

in performance and reporting of regular quality assurance reviews exceeding a period of one year. The EMD Center has sited ongoing staff recruitment and retention issues as the primary cause for the deficiencies and has sought to contract this service out with the International Academy of Emergency Dispatch to meet the requirements going forward.

The Committees recommendation is to resolve this case by offering a consent agreement with a censure; citing violation of Maine EMS Rule Chapter 3-A $\delta(1)$ and $\delta(1)(B)(4)$ and 32 M.R.S. $\delta\delta(5-A(3)(D)$; requiring that the center add a means for ensuring that they are only using licensed EMDs for processing emergency medical calls; recognizing mitigating circumstances that the organization has taken steps to outsource QA reviews and has drafted a proper QA/QI policy; and recognizing aggravating circumstances that the organization failed to notify the Maine EMS office or seek a waiver knowing that they were deficient in quality assurance.

Case 21-165 Summary: A new applicant for an EMT license disclosed a history of criminal convictions for OUI in 2013 and for criminal trespass in 2015, an incident which was reportedly a misunderstanding but also occurred while they were intoxicated. The applicant reports they have made several life changes including maintaining their sobriety for the last three and ha half years and becoming involved in their community as a volunteer driver with the EMS agency.

The Committee recommends issuing the EMT license; finding the applicant has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust.

a. LD 1258

This is legislation based on the LD2105 Committee's recommendations. This legislation includes a certificate of need and directs the Board to create rules for this purpose and to prevent further inefficiencies from being inserted into the system. This also requires a cost reporting requirement from the Maine EMS Office to create a pathway to monitor necessary rate changes over time.
