- c. Training Centers
 - i. Pass Rates Discussion to have pass rates for all license levels and all training centers calculated and posted to the web. There was consensus that this was a sound idea but there needed to be a process outlined to ensure appropriate and consistent reporting.
 - ii. Retention Rates As there is a lot of variation in how retention rates are calculated it was determined that Leah and Don would review the COAEMSP document and determine its efficacy for reporting to the state and for lower license levels. They will provide a draft proposal for further discussion at the next meeting.

VII. New Business:

Dr. Judy Tupper (Muskie School) – Presentation on her Infection Control project for her thesis. Judy created the infection control training on MEMSEd and set out to assess the efficacy of this platform in improving the knowledge of EMS providers utilizing a pre and post test. Dr. Tupper also looked at the differences in knowledge by license level and setting in which a provider worked(urban, rural). The study did demonstrate an improvement in knowledge of infectious disease and control measures.
