- 6) UPDATE Medication Shortages Nash /Zimmerman/All 0925 0935
 - a. Sodium Bicarb is becoming a problem now at the service level. There has been an FDA extension and we should ensure services are aware to check the FDA list.
 - b. This primarily effects cardiac arrest and TCA overdose which requires a significant amount. We will need to continue to monitor.
- 7) Follow Up Discussion re: re-arrest in route to the hospital Pieh/Zimmerman/All 0945 1000
 - a. Dr. Diaz and Dr. Pieh put together a synopsis of how they have navigated the issues and regulations around this to support other hospitals. This has been well received and a few hospitals have asked for some clarification. Hospitals continue to work to support these efforts and have continued working with Dr. Sholl. Dr. Sholl is continuing to hold off sending out the EMS letter until these hospitals have had more time to adjust their practice.

- a. Dr. Sholl is going to work with Dr. Pieh to draft up resuscitation guidelines and move this to the green section.
- 3. CMS Language re: restraint Collamore
 - a. Dr. Collamore spoke with the Joint Commission and they didn't have a lot of guidance support for EMS. She has suggested that we add language that requires EMS to notify Medical Control as soon as possible.
 - i. There was concern discussed about the restrictions within the hospital and how to translate that into a functional but protected EMS practice.
 - ii. Dr. Sholl will work with Dr. Collamore to craft some language and bring it back to the group.

 - a. Dr. Collamore and Dr. Zimmerman will follow up with their contacts and
- 6. Final Yellow topics Collamore/Zimmerman
 - a. Radiation Injuries
 - i. Dr. Zimmerman presented a new protocol
 - ii. Dr. Sholl asked Pete and Dr. Dinerman about if we should call out air medical transport in this situation. We don't do this in any other situation.
 - iii. Pete recommends that we keep language recommending transport does not occur until the patient is appropriately deconned.
 - iv. Dr. Pieh will connect with MANG to see if they have any additional insight on this.
 - b. Stroke Alert update change timeline to 24 hours from 6 hours.
 - c. Naloxone at the EMR level
 - i. There are some operational difficulties but consensus was to add this.
 - ii. We will add orange as the behavioral section.
- ii. Green Section Review Pieh/Sholl
 - 1. Chest Trauma
 - a. Changes to the site of chest decompression. To the anterior axillary
 - b. Add pearl to remind providers to constantly monitor this and changes and symptoms reoccur consider repeating procedure.
 - 2. Head trauma
 - a. O2 saturation cleaned up. Added language about monitoring for signs of herniation and ventilating to achieve an ETCO2 30-35 mmHg. Added pearls
 - b. Rick will pull a paper on rate recommendation of ventilation for **EMTs**
 - c. Dr. Bohanske will look at the brain injury foundation
 - 3. TXA has been corrected for medical control requirements.
 - 4. Update some language around TXA and isolated head trauma as there has been some questions around patients with multisystem trauma.
