Case Review (EMMC)	Dr. Burke presented a case involving male, struck by a car at high speed. Initial presentation to EMS was unresponsive and in shock. Dr. Burke commented that the EMS care was very appropriate and timely; assessment in the ED showed a fractured pelvis with and injury to the descending Aorta and widening pulse pressure. Patient to surgery; died from an Aortic Root injury. Discussion about value of angiograms vs. CT scan for diagnosis.	
State Trauma Plan	Rick reported that the revised state Trauma Plan was approved by the Board of EMS as proposed by the TAC. The updated plan will be uploaded to the Trauma Advisory Committee section of the Maine EMS Website.
