

2021-2022 Heating Season - Weekly Fuel Prices August 15, 2022

The Governor's Energy Office (GEO) conducts a weekly survey of heating fuel prices, obtained from fuel retailers statewide. This survey provides the current Maine cash prices, in dollars, rounded to the nearest penny.

*Please Note: The price for the various heating fuels are statewide averages, and prices in a specific geographic region of the state may be considerably higher or lower than this average. These statewide averages are spot cash prices, and not 'pre-buy', introductory, or otherwise discounted prices. Average propane prices are 30-day cash/credit prices, based on consumption of at least 900 gallons a year. Households using propane just for cooking or hot water generally pay a higher per gallon price.¹

The Energy Office has a calculator on its web site that allows consumers to obtain more detailed estimates of home heating costs, and the price impacts of various types of fuel, heating systems and heating appliances. Heating costs vary considerably from home to home. The home heating calculator can assist homeowners in finding the best heating option for their home, location, lifestyle, and budget.

Below is a table that compares various heating fuels, on a dollar per million Btu (heating unit). Consumers will then need to consider the efficiency of their heating system(s) to estimate their overall heating costs.

Includes minimum monthly fees. ⁴ price stated reflects the fact that heat pumps and heat pump water heaters use electricity much more efficiently. In Maine, cold climate heat pumps are on average 2.93 times more efficient than electric resistance heating; heat pump water heaters are 2.98 times more efficient.
