Re: Leadership PAC Investigation – Charlotte PAC

On November 18, 2020, the Commission authorized an enhanced compliance review of fifteen (15) political action committees that, in 2020, were led by Legislators and raised or spent over \$5,000 in the year. The Commission staff sent the Charlotte (the "PAC") an initial request for records on 12/08/2020. ETH. 33-34. Those records were received on or before January 31, 2021, and a supplemental request for records was sent on 03/09/2021. ETH. 35-36. Upon reviewing the information provided by the PAC, the Commission staff found four potential violation and two exceptions.

On 06/07/2021, the Commission staff mailed its preliminary findings to the PAC's officers requesting comment. ETH. 25-32. The Commission staff requested that any response be provided by 06/28/2021. On 07/13/2021, the Commission received five emails and supporting documents from the PAC. ETH. 1-24. The Commission staff is recommending a total penalty of \$400 for four potential violations.

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Receipt Retention. The treasurer of a PAC shall retain a vendor invoice or receipt stating the particular goods or services purchased for every expenditure in excess of \$50 to initiate or influence a campaign. 21-A M.R.S. § 1057(2).

Reporting Contributions. A PAC who receives more than \$50 in contributions from a person must itemize their contributions and include the person's name, occupation, place of business, and mailing address. 21-A M.R.S. § 1060(6).

Reporting Expenditures. A PAC must report all expenditures to initiate or influence a campaign and include the payee, purpose, whether it was to support or oppose a candidate or referendum. 21-A M.R.S. § 1060(4). The PAC must also report operational

expenditures that are not made for the purpose of influencing a campaign. 21-A M.R.S. § 1060(4).

Substantial Misreporting. A person that files a campaign finance report that substantially misreports contributions, expenditures, or other campaign activity may be assessed a penalty not to exceed \$5,000. 21-A M.R.S. § 1004-A(4).

Self-Enrichment. A PAC may reimburse a Legislator, who is also an officer of the PAC, for purchases made on behalf of the PAC and for travel expenses. 21-A M.R.S. § 1054-B. Allowable reimbursements do not include payments made for the purpose of personal financial enrichment of the Legislator. <u>Id.</u>

Lobbyist Contributions. A member of the Legislature may not intentionally solicit or accept a contribution from a lobbyist during any period of time in which the Legislature is convened before final adjournment. 1 M.R.S. § 1015 (Repealed). The Commission may assess a fine of up to \$1,000 to a person who violates this section. <u>Id.</u>

ANALYSIS AND STAFF RECOMMENDATION

During the Commission staff's review of the PAC's records, the Commission staff flagged five issues for further review:

- 1. Failure to Maintain Receipts;
- 2. Failure to Report Transactions;
- 3. Contributions from a Registered Lobbyist;
- 4. Potential Self-Enrichment; and
- 5. Inaccurate Transactions.

Failure to Maintain Receipts

A PAC shall retain a vendor invoice or receipt stating the particular goods or services purchased for every expenditure in excess of \$50. 21-A M.R.S. § 1057. After providing the supplemental records in response to the Commission staff's March 9th letter, Commission staff determined that the PAC was missing the following receipts:

- 01/10/2020 expenditure at Cross Café for \$114
- 02/09/2020 expenditure to Margaret Chase Smith Policy Center (for Reception) for \$107.72

- 02/20/2020 expenditure to WAND (for conference) for \$150
- 02/22/2020 expenditure to Bombay Mahal for \$54.30
- 03/07/2020 expenditure to Staples for \$118.17
- 07/24/2020 expenditure to Constant Contact for \$68.58
- 1/19/2020 expenditure to NAACP Portland (Dinner) for \$81.20

These missing receipts represented approximately 33% of the receipts that the PAC was required to retain in 2020. After receiving the staff's preliminary findings, the PAC submitted receipts for four¹ of the above transactions. Only the receipt for Cross Café appears to be an original, while the remaining receipts were copies obtained in response to the Commission staff's inquiries and potential financial penalties.

In the view of the Commission staff, the purpose of this provision is for the PAC to maintain itemized records of its expenditures from third parties. The ability to obtain copies of the receipts from vendors does not appear to meet the spirit of the provision, and the PAC cannot be said to have "**retain**[ed] a vendor invoice or receipt" for these expenditures.

A committee that fails to keep records required by this chapter may be assessed a fine of up to \$10,000 or the amount of financial activity for which no records were kept, whichever is greater. 21-A M.R.S. § 1062-B. In assessing a fine, the Commission shall consider, among other things, whether the violation was intention, whether the violation occurred as the result of an error by someone outside the control of the committee, whether the committee intended to conceal its financial activity, the amount of financial activity that was not documented, and the level of experience of the committee's staff. 21-A M.R.S. § 1062-B.

The Commission staff accepts that there was no intent to deceive the public or intentionally violate the Act. The Commission staff would accept that these missing receipts were due to poor record keeping. The Commission staff recommends that the Commission find a potential violation and impose a financial penalty of \$250 for the missing receipts.

Failure to Report Transactions

A PAC is required to report all expenditures to support or oppose candidates and all operational expenditures. 21-A M.R.S. § 1060. The Commission staff flagged seven² issues relating to failure to report transactions.

Betsy Sweet. On 06/29/2020, the PAC made a \$100 contribution to support Betsy Sweet. ETH. 50. This contribution was not reported by the PAC in its 11-Day Pre-Primary Election Report. The PAC explains that Rep. Warren accidentally made the contribution from the PAC account instead of her personal account. ETH. 1. Rep. Warren reimbursed the PAC on 07/24/2020 for that expenditure. ETH. 1. The Commission staff considers this issue to be resolved and recommends no further action.

Bangor Residence Inn. The PAC reported a contribution of \$250 from Drummond Woodsum being received on 08/06/2020. The contribution, however, was from Bangor Residence Inn.³ The Commission staff considers this issue to be a potential violation.

Maureen AuCoin for Mayor. The PAC made a \$400 contribution to Maureen AuCoin for Mayor on 08/15/2020, which the PAC did not report. Rep. Warren indicated to the Commission staff that the system would not allow her to enter the transaction. Rep. Warren did not contact Commission staff to resolve that issue at the time.

The Commission's website allows a PAC to indicate whether a payment is to support or oppose a candidate by providing a checkbox for the PAC, shown below:



The system then pulls from the list of statewide candidates. Non-statewide candidates, such as municipal or federal candidates, do not appear on this list. To enter a non-statewide candidate, the PAC would leave that box unchecked and indicate in the expenditure description that the payment was to support a candidate. The Commission staff considers this issue to be a potential violation.

Maine Bankers Association. The PAC received a contribution of \$500 received on 09/24/2020 from the Maine Bankers Associations that was not. The PAC acknowledges that this was an error. The Commission staff considers this to be a potential violation.

Potential Financial Penalty. The Commission staff recommends finding three potential violations for failing to report transactions for the Bangor Residence Inn, Maureen AuCoin for Mayor, and the Maine Bankers Association. The Commission staff does not believe that these potential violations would make the associated reports substantially non-conforming under 21-A M.R.S. § 1062-A(2). The transactions themselves, however, would have been substantially misreported by their omissions. 21-A M.R.S. § 1004-A(4). Under this penalty section, the Commission could impose a penalty of up to \$5,000 for these violations. The Commission staff recommends that the Commission find three violations and impose a total financial penalty of \$150.

Contributions from a Registered Lobbyist

When the Legislature is in session a Legislator may not accept a contribution from a registered lobbyist. 1 M.R.S. § 1015 (Repealed). On 01/08/2020, the PAC reported a \$200 contribution from Mr. Jake Mitchell, who was a registered lobbyist at the time. The Legislature convened on the same day, 01/08/2020, at 10:00 AM.

The PAC has indicated that the contribution was made prior to 10:00 AM on 01/08/2020. ETH. 2. The Commission staff accepts the PAC's statement of events. For this reason, the Commission staff considers this issue resolved and recommends no further action.

Potential Self-Enrichment

A PAC may reimburse a Legislator for expenses incurred in the proper performance of their duties, for purchases made on behalf of the PAC, or for travel expenses associated with volunteering for the PAC. 21-A M.R.S. § 1054-B. Allowable reimbursements for expenses do not include payments that are determined by the Commission to be for the purpose of the personal financial enrichment of the Legislator. <u>Id.</u>

On 06/11/2020, the PAC made an expenditure of \$213.86 to Verizon. ETH. 54. This payment covered two months of bills for Rep. Warren's primary phone (as listed on her 2020 candidate account and PAC account). ETH. 54. This payment was the only time the PAC paid for the cell phone. ETH. 54.

The Commission staff noted this expenditure because it seemed reasonable that the bill was paid by the PAC to avoid a disconnection by Verizon. The Commission has not provided a strong guidance to staff on what types of activities are personal enrichment by a Legislator. If the Commission considers this payment to be a violation, then Commission staff would recommend no further action because Rep. Warren has reimbursed the PAC for that payment. ETH. 23.

Inaccurate Transactions

A PAC must accurately report its expenditure. 21-A M.R.S. §§ 1054-A, 1060. On 10/05/2020, the PAC reported paying ActBlue fees of \$29.48, but the ActBlue statement shows that fees of \$25.53 were paid. ETH. 57. The PAC also reported a payment of \$57.95 to Westin, occurring on 03/13/2020, but the payment was made on 01/13/2020.

ETH. 41. The Commission staff considers these issues to be exceptions due to their minimal nature and recommends no further action.

CONCLUSION

The Commission staff recommends that the Commission impose a \$400 penalty for failing to retain receipts and omitting transactions from the PAC's campaign finance reports.

The Commission staff believes there is a pattern of the PAC failing to maintain receipts of its transactions. In response to the Commission staff's supplemental request, the PAC provided bank statements that show the following transactions but did not provide receipts from the vendors. The transactions with missing receipts are:

- 01/10/2020 expenditure at Cross Café for \$114 SUBMITIED
- 02/09/2020 expenditure to Margaret Chase Smith Policy Center (for Reception) for \$107.72
- 02/20/2020 expenditure to WAND (for conference) for \$150
- 02/22/2020 expenditure to Bombay Mahal for \$54.30
- 03/07/2020 expenditure to Staples for \$118.17 SVBMITTED
- 07/24/2020 expenditure to Constant Contact for \$68.58 SWEMLTED
- 1/19/2020 expenditure to NAACP Portland (Dinner) for \$81.20

In 2020, the PAC had twenty-two expenditures that triggered the requirement to retain a receipt and the PAC is missing seven receipts (approximately a 33% error rate). The Commission staff has routinely recommended that a missing receipt constitutes an exception; however, due to the high error rate, the Commission staff believes this constitutes a pattern and recommends that this be treated as one potential violation.

At this time, the Commission staff intends to recommend a finding that the PAC violated 21-A M.R.S. § 1057(2) by not keeping a vendor invoice or receipt for seven expenditures. Under 21-A M.R.S. § 1062-B, the Commission can impose a penalty of no more than \$693.97 - the value of financial activity for which no records were kept. The Commission staff recommends a penalty of \$250 for failing to retain the seven receipts.

Failure to Report Transactions. The next major violation is the unreported transactions. The PAC's bank account shows the following transactions were not reported:

- 06/29/2020, the PAC made a \$100 contribution to support Betsy Sweet. SENT EXPLAINER
- 07/24/2020, the PAC deposited \$183.68 from unknown sources. SENT EXPLANCE
- 08/06/2020, the PAC received a \$250 contribution from Bangor Residence Inn.² MISTAKE IN The contribution was improperly reported as a contribution from Drummond Woodsum.

² The check was also made out to her candidate campaign. It is possible that these checks were accidentally swapped but the Commission staff has received no record of the Drummond Woodsum deposit.

- 08/15/2020, the PAC made a \$400 contribution to Maureen AuCoin for Mayor. SySTEM DISAULW
- 08/28/2020, the PAC made a \$400 expenditure to Constant Contact. Not Sure ? SEE EMALL
- 09/24/2020, the PAC received a \$500 contribution from Maine Bankers MISTAKE Association.
- 10/07/2020, the PAC deposited \$500 in excess of what was reported. PESULT OF THIS

These omitted transactions could³ result in one of two potential violations, either the report is substantially non-conforming, in which case, the penalty is calculated as if the report was filed late, or the omitted transactions constitute substantial misreporting and the Commission may impose a penalty of \$5,000.

The Commission staff does not believe that these omitted transactions rise to the level of substantially non-conforming reports, but the relevant information for the evaluation is in the below tables:

I. Overview of Findings

The Commission staff requested the Committee's records on 12/08/2020. Records were provided on or about 01/31/2021. A request for additional records was mailed on 03/08/2021. The additional records were received on or about 03/19/2021. After review, the Commission staff has found multiple potential violations and exceptions. The Commission staff recommends a penalty of \$600 and disgorgement/repayment of funds.

II. History of Committee

Charlotte PAC registered as a political action committee on 08/12/2015. Representative Charlotte Warren is the Principal Officer and Mr. Shawn Warren is the Treasurer. In 2020, the Committee raised \$7,895.00 and spent \$12,779.00.

III. Procedures

In the 12/08/2020 letter, the Commission staff requested the Committee produce the following 2020 records: (1) bank statements; (2) receipts/invoices for all expenditures over \$50; (3) documentation of any new loans or debts; and (4) records from ActBlue/Anedot or similar fundraising services.

After receiving the records, the Commission staff compared the provided records against the reported transactions for incorrect reporting. Specifically, the Commission staff reviewed the records for: omitted or duplicate transactions, failure to itemize contributions, prohibited payments, misuse of funds for personal enrichment in violation of 21-A M.R.S. § 1054-B, failure to keep records, improper contributions and other errors.

In the review of the Charlotte PAC, the Commission staff found that additional records would be required. On 03/09/2021, the Commission staff sent an email requesting the following:

IV. Potential Violation

The Commission staff found four areas of potential violations for the Commission's review.

Failure to Maintain Receipts. The first potential violation the Commission staff found is a failure to maintain receipts/invoices. 21-A M.R.S. § 1057. The Commission staff

would normally find this to be a minor infraction; however, if there is a pattern, multiple minor infractions can be considered a potential violation.

The Commission staff believes there is a pattern of the PAC failing to maintain receipts of its transactions. In response to the Commission staff's supplemental request, the PAC provided bank statements that show the following transactions but did not provide receipts from the vendors. The transactions with missing receipts are:

- 01/10/2020 expenditure at Cross Café for \$114
- 02/09/2020 expenditure to Margaret Chase Smith Policy Center (for Reception) for \$107.72
- 02/20/2020 expenditure to WAND (for conference) for \$150
- 02/22/2020 expenditure to Bombay Mahal for \$54.30
- 03/07/2020 expenditure to Staples for \$118.17
- 07/24/2020 expenditure to Constant Contact for \$68.58
- 1/19/2020 expenditure to NAACP Portland (Dinner) for \$81.20

In 2020, the PAC had twenty-two expenditures that triggered the requirement to retain a receipt and the PAC is missing seven receipts (approximately a 33% error rate). The Commission staff has routinely recommended that a missing receipt constitutes an exception; however, due to the high error rate, the Commission staff believes this constitutes a pattern and recommends that this be treated as one potential violation.

At this time, the Commission staff intends to recommend a finding that the PAC violated 21-A M.R.S. § 1057(2) by not keeping a vendor invoice or receipt for seven expenditures. Under 21-A M.R.S. § 1062-B, the Commission can impose a penalty of no more than \$693.97 - the value of financial activity for which no records were kept. The Commission staff recommends a penalty of \$250 for failing to retain the seven receipts.

Failure to Report Transactions. The next major violation is the unreported transactions. The PAC's bank account shows the following transactions were not reported:

- 10/07/2020, the PAC deposited \$500 in excess of what was reported.

These omitted transactions could³ result in one of two potential violations, either the report is substantially non-conforming, in which case, the penalty is calculated as if the report was filed late, or the omitted transactions constitute substantial misreporting and the Commission may impose a penalty of \$5,000.

In determining whether a report is substantially non-conforming the most important factor is the percentage of the omitted transactions when compared to what was reported. There is no specific threshold to look for but certainly if the percentage is above 50%, then there is a strong indication that the report was substantially non-conforming. The Commission could make a finding that the October Quarterly Report is substantially non-conforming because of the high omitted percentage of the expenditures, but the PAC also reported \$3,745 of contributions accurately in that same report; a similar analysis can be done for the 42-Day Post-Primary Report. If the Commission finds a report to be substantially non-conforming, then the Commission staff recommends imposing a penalty of \$750 per report.

The Commission staff believes these omitted transactions will more appropriately fit under the substantial misreporting penalties of 21-A M.R.S. § 1004-A(4). At this time, the Commission staff recommends finding that the PAC substantially misreported its financial activity by not disclosing these transactions and assessing a \$50 penalty for each omitted transaction, resulting in a collective \$350 penalty.

Contributions from a Registered Lobbyist. The next major violation is that on 01/08/2020, the PAC accepted a \$200 contribution from Mr. Jake Mitchell, who was a registered lobbyist at the time. A Leadership PAC may not accept a contribution from a registered lobbyist during the legislative session. 1 M.R.S. § 1015 (repealed 06/16/2020) (the section was replaced by 1 M.R.S. § 1015-A, which still prohibits contributions from lobbyists during a legislative session). The Legislature convened on the same day, 01/08/2020, at 10:00 AM. If the contribution were made prior to that time, then § 1015 was not violated, however, additional information should be gathered as to this potential violation. The Commission may assess up to \$1,000 as a penalty. 1 M.R.S. § 1015(D) (repealed 06/16/2020). Alternatively, the Commission staff routinely recommends disgorging the improperly received funds, which if a violation is found, would be its recommendation here.

Possible Self-Enrichment. A PAC reimburse them a Legislator for expenses incurred in the proper performance of their duties, for purchases made on behalf of the PAC, or for

travel expenses associated with volunteering for the PAC. 21-A M.R.S. § 1054-B. Allowable reimbursements for expenses do not include payments that are determined by the Commission to be for the purpose of the personal financial enrichment of the Legislator. Id. On 06/11/2020, the PAC made an expenditure of \$213.86 to Verizon. This payment covered two months of bills for Rep. Warren's primary phone (as listed on her 2020 candidate account and PAC account). This payment was the only time the PAC paid for the cell phone. The Commission staff is not concluding whether this is or is not a violation but wanted to note it for the Commission. There is no financial penalty for this violation. If the PAC knowingly made the expenditure in violation of this Chapter, then it is treated as a Class E crime. 21-A M.R.S. § 1004. The Commission staff recommends that, if the Commission views the expenditures as a violation of 21-A M.R.S. § 1054-B, Rep. Warren repay the funds to the PAC.

V. Exceptions

On 10/05/2020 the PAC reported paying ActBlue fees of \$29.48; the documents provided show the fees were \$25.53.

The PAC reported a \$57.95 charge to the Westin on 03/13/2020; the charge was actually made on 01/13/2020.

VI. Conclusions and Recommendations

Based on the foregoing findings, the Commission staff recommends imposing a penalty of \$600 for the noted potential violations and that the PAC return the \$200 contribution from Jake Mitchell if the contribution was made after the session began. The Commission staff also recommends that Rep. Warren repay \$213.86 to the PAC for its payment of her Verizon phone bill (if determined to be a violation of § 1054-B).

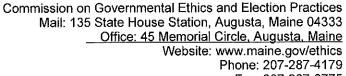

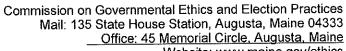

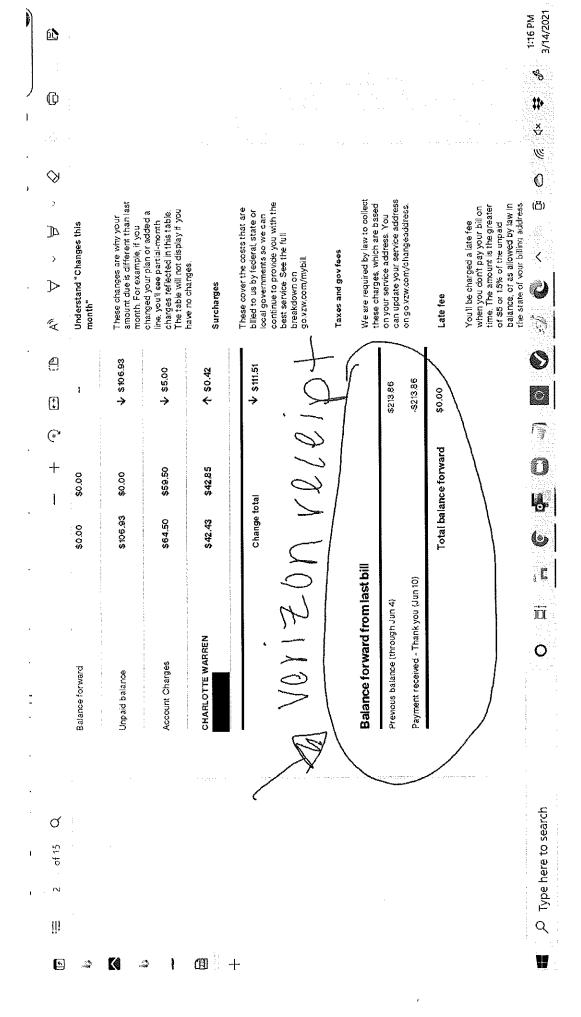
