Re: Local 349 PAC Fund – Waiver Request

The Local 349 PAC Fund (the PAC) filed their 42-Day Post-Primary Report on July 22, 2024 with no activity. On September 11, 2024 the PAC filed an amended report with \$1,369.17 in contributions making the original report substantially non-complaint and triggered a preliminary penalty of \$1,369. The PAC is seeking a waiver.

## LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

A PAC must file a campaign finance report due 11 days before the primary election, and one due 42 days after. 21-A M.R.S. § 1059(2)(B). A campaign finance report is not timely filed unless a properly signed or electronically submitted copy of the report, substantially conforming to the disclosure requirements of the law, is received by the commission by 11:59 p.m. on the date it is due. 21-A M.R.S. § 1062-A(2). If a committee is late in filing a campaign finance report, the amount of the penalty is set by a formula which takes into consideration a percentage of the total contributions or expenditures, whichever is greater, the number of prior violations within a two-year period, and the number of days the report is late. 21-A M.R.S. § 1062-A(3).

## DISCUSSION AND STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The PAC has been registered with the Commission for many years and is an experienced filer. This is their first late report. The PAC contends that a communication error led to the substantially non-complaint report that omitted their fundraising for the period. The efiling system sends automated messages to PACs prior to each filing 2 weeks before, 1 week before and 1 day before the deadline. Additionally, the PAC filing deadlines can be viewed on their efiling homepage, and the Commission's website.

When a PAC fails to report a large swath of information, such as all of their contributions from a reporting period, Commission staff find that to be substantially non-compliant to the requirements of law. In this case, the staff applied the penalty provision as if the report was filed 50 days late on September 11, 2024, and calculated the preliminary penalty amount of \$1,369 as follows:

The PAC seeks a waiver of the penalty because this was an honest mistake that had no ill-intent. When they realized their error, they amended their 42-Day Post-Primary Report. There have not been any instances of substantial non-compliance in PAC reporting in recent years. The Commission staff recommend reducing the penalty to \$500.

Thank you for taking my call and explaining the request for waiver procedure, as noted in your letter.

We received a notice that we were in error of reporting stating Substantially Non-Compliant 42 Day Post-Primary Report:

Stating the Commission staff determined Local 349 PAC owed \$1,369.

Due to an oversight by new administrator in our Portland office not forwarding information pertinent to our report, our Treasurer filed the July 22, 2024, report with incorrect information. Upon discovering contributions were made, the Treasurer amended the report on September 11, 2024, to correct the error.

Once corrected we were required to re-file the report which is the reason for the September 11 late filing.

We apologize for our error; this is the first penalty we received since we opened this PAC account over ten years, we hope the ethics committee can forgive the \$1,369 penalty. All money currently remains in our Local 349 PAC fund.

#### Re: Substantially Non-Compliant 42-Day Post-Primary Report

Dear Mr. Grinvalsky:

The Commission staff has made a finding that the Local 349 PAC Fund was substantially non-compliant when it filed its 42-Day Post Primary Report on July 22, 2024 with no activity. The PAC submitted an amended report on September 11, 2024 with \$1,369.17 in contributions making the original report substantially non-compliant with the Maine's reporting laws resulting in a late-filing penalty based on the original due date of the report. As such, the report was due by 11:59 p.m. on July 23, 2024, but was not filed until September 11, 2024. Under the Commission's statutes, the late filing of a report triggers an enforcement process. (21-A M.R.S. § 1062-A). Based on the amount of financial activity in the report, the number of calendar days the report was late, and the history of violations from the committee, the Commission staff has determined a penalty of \$1,369 is owed.

If the PAC disagrees with this preliminary penalty, it may make a written request that the Commission waive the violation or penalty in whole or in part. Any request for a waiver must be made within 14 calendar days of your receipt of this notice; it must be in writing and contain a full explanation of the reasons the committee filed late. Upon receipt, staff will schedule your appeal for the next public meeting of the Commission.

The Commission may waive the penalty if it determines the report was late due to mitigating circumstances, which are defined as (1) a valid emergency; (2) an error made by the Commission staff; or (3) relevant evidence the committee made a bona fide effort to file the report on time. Also, the Commission may waive the penalty if it is disproportionate to the level of experience of the person filing the report or the harm suffered by the public from the late disclosure.

## Memo to Commissioners re: Local 349 PAC Waiver Request – Text of Legal Authority Cited in Memo in order Referenced

#### 21-A M.R.S. § 1059(2)(B)

Chapter 13: <u>Campaign Finance Reports</u>

§ 1059. <u>Report; filing requirements</u>

2. <u>Reporting schedule</u>. A committee shall file reports according to the following schedule.

B. During any year in which primary and general elections are held, a committee shall file primary and general election reports in addition to the reports required under paragraph A:

(1) On the 11th day before the date on which the election is held, which must be complete as of the 14th day before that date; and

(2) On the 42nd day after the date on which the election is held, which must be complete as of the 35th day after that date.

A committee shall file primary and general election reports even if the committee did not engage in financial activity to influence the primary or general election.

#### 21-A M.R.S. § 1062-A(2)

Chapter 13: Campaign Finance Reports

§ 1062-A. Failure to file on time

2. Campaign finance reports. A campaign finance report is not timely filed unless a properly signed or electronically submitted copy of the report, substantially conforming to the disclosure requirements of this subchapter, is received by the commission by 11:59 p.m. on the date it is due. Except as provided in subsection 6, the commission shall determine whether a required report satisfies the requirements for timely filing. The commission may waive a penalty in whole or in part if it is disproportionate to the level of experience of the person filing the report or to the harm suffered by the public from the late disclosure. The commission may waive the penalty in whole or in part if the commission determines the failure to file a timely report was due to mitigating circumstances. For purposes of this section, "mitigating circumstances" means:

A. A valid emergency of the committee treasurer determined by the commission, in the interest of the sound administration of justice, to warrant the waiver of the penalty in whole or in part;

B. An error by the commission staff; or

C. Other circumstances determined by the commission that warrant mitigation of the penalty, based upon relevant evidence presented that a bona fide effort was made to file the report in accordance with the statutory requirements, including, but not limited to, unexplained delays in postal service or interruptions in Internet service.

#### 21-A M.R.S. § 1062-A(3)

Chapter 13: <u>Campaign Finance Reports</u>

§ 1062-A. Failure to file on time

3. <u>Basis for penalties</u>. The penalty for late filing of a report required under this subchapter is a percentage of the total contributions or expenditures for the filing period, whichever is greater, multiplied by the number of calendar days late, as follows:

- A. For the first violation, 2%;
- B. For the 2nd violation, 4%; and
- C. For the 3rd and subsequent violations, 6%.

Any penalty of less than \$25 is waived.

Violations accumulate on reports with filing deadlines in a 2-year period that begins on January 1st of each even-numbered calendar year. Waiver of a penalty does not nullify the finding of a violation.

A report required to be filed under this subchapter that is sent by certified or registered United States mail and postmarked at least 2 days before the deadline is not subject to penalty.
