- Re: Request by Scott Gaiason Campaign for Waiver of Late-Filing Penalty Due to Late 11-Day Pre-General Report

Scott Gaiason was a Maine Clean Election Act (MCEA) candidate running for the Maine House, District 56. Mr. Gaiason is an experienced candidate, having previously run three times for the Maine House of Representatives.

Mr. Gaiason's campaign was required to file the regularly scheduled 11-Day Pre-General Report by 11:59 p.m. on October 23, 2020. Mr. Gaiason filed the report on October 24th, one day late. The preliminary penalty for the late report is \$109.54. Mr. Gaiason's campaign is requesting a waiver of the penalty.

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Candidates are required to file the 11-Day Pre-General Report no later than 11:59 p.m. on the 11th day before the date on which an election is held and must be complete for the filing period as of the 14th day before that date. 21-A M.R.S. § 1017(3-A)(B). If the candidate is late in filing a regularly scheduled campaign finance report, the amount of the penalty is set by a formula which takes into consideration a percentage of the total contributions or expenditures, whichever is greater, the number of prior violations within a two-year period, and the number of days the report is late. 21-A M.R.S. § 1020-A(4-A).

DISCUSSION

On October 23, 2020, at 3:01 p.m., Candidate Registrar Emma Burke sent an email message (attached) to all her assigned candidates who had not yet filed their 11-Day Pre-General Reports. This included Mr. Gaiason. At 8:13 p.m., also on October 23rd, Ms. Burke sent another reminder email to all candidates whose reports were not filed yet (attached), which again included Mr. Gaiason, reminding them they only had a few hours to file their reports.

In addition to these two emails sent by Ms. Burke the day of the report deadline, the Commission's eFiling website also sends automatic reminder emails to candidates and treasurers two weeks, one week, and one day before the filing due date. This means that Mr. Gaiason received four emails about the 11-Day Pre-General Report's due date. Mr. Gaiason did not respond to any of these communications.

Based on the statutory formula for calculating late-filing penalties, the preliminary penalty amount is \$109.54, calculated as follows:

Mr. Gaiason's report was filed at 1:08 a.m. on October 24th, making the report slightly over an hour late. In Mr. Gaiason's waiver request, he states that he "update[ed] expenditures" in the eFiling website shortly after 9:00 p.m. on October 23rd. However, according to the eFiling event log (attached), Mr. Gaiason did not log into the eFiling website between September 22nd (the date of the last reporting deadline) and October 24th. Mr. Gaiason also only had one expenditure to enter.

Also in Mr. Gaiason's waiver request, he states that he did not have time to regularly access the email address we use for him, and that he has other email addresses he uses more often. The email address we use for Mr. Gaiason is the one he registered with, and he has not previously mentioned he has other email addresses that he communicates with

more regularly. Mr. Gaiason had the ability to change the email address we use for him on the eFiling website, or he could have notified Ms. Burke it would be better if she used a different email address. Mr. Gaiason also started receiving email reminders for the October 23rd filing deadline two weeks prior the deadline.

It should also be noted that Mr. Gaiason admits to logging in to the eFiling system under his treasurer's username (who is his wife) and filing his own report. Candidates who are participating in the MCEA are prohibited from filing their own reports, according to 21-A M.R.S. § 1125(12-D).

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Timely campaign finance reports are an integral part of campaign finance transparency and disclosure. It is clear that their timely filing is considered to be of utmost importance, as statute requires late-filing penalties to increase by each day past the due date the report is filed. All campaigns, particularly experienced ones, are expected to pay attention to and meet all reporting deadlines, especially when multiple reminders are sent for each due date.

Generally, in 2018, the Commission waived late-filing penalties against candidates downward to a range of \$300 - \$400, for example:

- from \$2,565.38 to \$300 late 24-Hour Report by Jan Collins
- from \$1,739.73 to \$400 incomplete 11-Day Pre-Primary Report by Mark Lawrence
- from \$384.00 to \$300 late 24-Hour Report by Ian Schwartz

The Commission *declined* to waive preliminary penalties that were already below \$300:

- \$112.00 late July Semiannual Report by Jeffrey Slocum
- \$115.93 late 24-Hour Report by Dana Dow
- \$235.03 late 24-Hour Reports by James LeBrecque

In this case, the preliminary penalty of \$109.54 is well below the \$300-\$400 range, and there are few to no mitigating factors. Mr. Gaiason is a very experienced candidate, and has been penalized in a prior election for filing a late report. He should be very aware of filing deadlines and requirements.

Mr. Gaiason is an experienced candidate who received a multitude of reminders for the filing deadline. His waiver request does not describe any of the mitigating factors set out in statute, and does make some claims that are not supported by the event log in the Commission's eFiling system. Therefore, the Commission staff recommends not reducing or waiving the penalty of \$109.54.

I got on my computer on the last day to make sure I had all my expenses entered. (And given what became my low key campaign, here were few.) After updating expenses, it was now after 9:00 in the evening and my treasurer, and wife, was going to bed so I gathered up her computer so it could be filed. I had some difficulty getting her computer working and subsequently fell asleep while working on this in my living room. I woke up and filed then, but it was after midnight by then.

Re: Notice of Violation and Penalty for Late-Filed 11-Day Pre-General Report

Dear Mr. Gaiason:

You were required to file the 11-Day Pre-General Report on October 23, 2020 by 11:59 p.m., but the report was not filed until October 24, 2020. Under the Commission's statutes (21-A M.R.S.A. § 1020-A(4-A)), the late filing of a report triggers an enforcement process. The Commission staff has made a preliminary finding of violation and determined that the preliminary penalty for filing the report late is \$109.54. Please see the next page for the penalty calculation.

You may request that the Commission waive the penalty in whole or in part or find that there was no violation. The request must be made within 14 calendar days of your receipt of this notice. The request must be in writing and contain a full explanation of the reasons the report was filed late. Upon receiving your request, the Commission staff will schedule your request to be heard at an upcoming Commission meeting. You or your designee will have an opportunity to be heard at the meeting or you may submit a sworn statement to the Commission explaining the mitigating circumstances for its consideration.

The Commission may waive or reduce the penalty or find that there was no violation if it determines that the report was late due to mitigating circumstances, which are defined as (1) a valid emergency; (2) an error made by the Commission staff; or (3) relevant evidence that a bona fide effort was made to file the report on time. The Commission may also consider whether the penalty is disproportionate to the size of the candidate's campaign, the level of experience of the candidate, treasurer or campaign staff, or the harm to the public caused by the late disclosure.

The staff requests that you pay the preliminary penalty within 14 days of the date of your receipt of this notice if you do not intend to request a waiver. Penalty Calculation

The penalty for filing a campaign finance report late is based on a percentage of the total contributions or expenditures for the reporting period, whichever is greater, multiplied by the number of days late. The percentage is based on your history of past violations: 2% for the first violation, 4% for the second violation, and 6% for the third and each subsequent violation. Violations for late-filed reports accumulate in the two-year period beginning on January 1st of each even-numbered year. A penalty accrues daily beginning on the day following the filing due date. Any penalty of less than \$10 is automatically waived.
