Re: Recommended Findings of Violation and Potential Penalties against Seven Unregistered Candidates

**Duty to register as a candidate.** Under 21-A M.R.S.A. § 1013-A(1)(A), candidates for state office are required to appoint a treasurer within 10 days of becoming a candidate and, within another 10 days, register as a candidate with the Commission. Registration is not difficult. A copy of the paper form is attached. Sections 2-A, 3, and 4 are optional, and Section 6 does not apply to most candidates. Candidates may complete an electronic form on the Commission's website, provided that they print it out, sign it and mail it to the Commission.

**Registrations received to date.** Most candidates are aware of the registration requirement through prior campaign experience or because they have heard about it from other candidates or the political parties. To date, 337 House candidates and 87 Senate candidates have registered (in addition to 73 county candidates).

**Unregistered Candidates.** Candidates who are unenrolled in a political party were required to qualify for the ballot by March 15, 2020 by filing nominating petitions with the Secretary of State. The Commission staff has diligently tried to get all 2020 candidates for legislative and county office to register by sending them notices and registration forms.

Prior to your May 27 meeting, if time permits, we will try to telephone them when numbers are available.

As of today, six House candidates and one county candidate have not registered with the Commission. We sent them the following notices by U.S. Mail to the addresses as shown on the website of the Maine Secretary of State:

**Recommendation by Commission staff.** The Commission staff recommends that, at your May 27 meeting, you find that the candidates violated 21-A M.R.S.A. § 1013-A(l)(A) by failing to timely register with the Commission. It might be appropriate to assess a penalty of up to \$100 against each of them, pursuant to 21-A M.R.S.A. § 1020-A(1). Given the unusual meeting procedures for the May 27 meeting, we may propose postponing any enforcement actions until the June 24 meeting. We will give this further consideration in advance of the May 27 meeting.
