Re: Request by James LaBrecque for Waiver of Late-Filing Penalty for 42-Day Post-General Report

James LaBrecque was a Maine Clean Election Act candidate in the 2018 general election for the Maine Senate, District 9. He ran as a replacement candidate and has been a candidate only once before, over fifteen years ago. His treasurer, Michael Capeci, is also treasurer for another candidate this election, Gary Capehart, as well as for a PAC; this is his only experience with an MCEA candidate.

All candidates who participated in the 2018 general election were required to file a 42-Day Post-General campaign finance report on December 18, 2018. Due to having been logged in under the candidate's credentials instead of his own, the treasurer, Mr. Capeci, did not file the report until the next day, December 19th, making the report one day late. The preliminary penalty for the late report is \$235.03 and the campaign is requesting a waiver of the penalty.

LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

Candidates participating in an election, either primary or general, must file a report by the 42nd day after the date on which the election was held, and must be complete for the filing period as of the 35th day after that date. (21-A M.R.S.A. § 1017(3-A)(D)) When a candidate is late in filing a report, the amount of the penalty is set by a formula which takes into consideration a percentage of the total contributions or expenditures, whichever is greater, the number of prior violations within a two-year period, and the number of days the report is late. (21-A M.R.S.A. § 1020-A(4-A))

DISCUSSION

Prior to the December 18, 2018 deadline, the Commission's efiling website sent automatic email reminders of the 42-Day Post-General Report to all candidates who were scheduled to file the report. (These emails were sent two weeks, one week and one day before the filing deadline.) Candidate Registrar Erin Gordon also directly emailed all her candidates to remind them of the report on the afternoon of the 18th (the email reminder is attached).

On December 19th, the morning following the deadline, Mr. Capeci called Registrar Gordon to explain that he had been logged in the previous evening prior to the 11:59 pm deadline but had been unable to file the report. Ms. Gordon determined from administrative logs (attached) that Mr. Capeci had been logged in under the candidate's credentials, which would have made it impossible for him to file the report. The campaign finance reports of an MCEA candidate must, by statute, be filed by the campaign treasurer or deputy treasurer. (21-A M.R.S.A. § 1125(12-D)) Accordingly, the Commission's efiling website does not allow candidates to file their own campaign finance reports. Ms. Gordon assisted Mr. Capeci with activating his own user credentials and he successfully filed the report later that day.

Based on the statutory formula for calculating late-filing penalties, the preliminary penalty amount is \$235.03, calculated as follows:

Through a letter dated January 28, 2019 (attached), the LaBrecque campaign asks that the Commission waive the preliminary penalty. Per Mr. Capeci, he attempted to file on time, which is shown by his log in attempts the evening of December 18, 2018. He cites lack of experience and technical difficulties as aggravating factors in meeting the deadline, but argues he was diligent in remedying the problem as soon as he could the following day.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Mr. Capeci was not the first treasurer for Mr. LaBrecque in the 2018 campaign. On November 11, 2018, he replaced a previous treasurer. The 42-Day Post-General Report was the first and only report that Mr. Capeci filed for the LaBrecque campaign. At the time of his appointment, Mr. Capeci would have received an email from the Commission's e-filing system, notifying him of his user name and inviting him to set up his own password. (The previous campaign treasurer used his own credentials to log into our system during September 22 – November 5, 2018.)

In the 2018 pre-election reminder newsletters, the Commission advised MCEA candidates and treasurers that *only* the treasurer and deputy treasurer may file a campaign finance reports (two examples are attached, with handwritten arrows marking the relevant language). Nevertheless, it is not uncommon for first-time MCEA candidates and treasurers to make the mistake of attempting to file under the candidate's credentials. (The other 2018 candidate for whom Mr. Capeci served as treasurer, Gary Capehart, was not in the MCEA program.)

At your April 25, 2018 meeting, the Commission gave direction to the staff that penalty recommendations for the 2018 election year should be higher than in previous years, in order to implement the 2015 citizen initiative. In 2014-2017, the Commission generally assessed penalties of \$100 - \$200 for legislative and county candidates who filed campaign finance reports late for various reasons (not understanding the requirements, miscommunication, IT challenges). For the 2018 cycle, we used \$300 as a baseline recommendation for late reports by legislative and county candidates, with the intention of sometimes recommending a higher or lower amount based on relevant factors such as the number of days late, the amount of activity reported late, the experience of the candidate or treasurer, etc. Penalty recommendations fell between \$250 and \$400.

In this case, we do not recommend reducing the penalty below \$235.03. Although the circumstances surrounding this late filing are understandable, they are not extenuating, and the preliminary penalty falls below the established range for late-filed campaign finance reports.

Re: Notice of Violation and Penalty for Late-Filed 42-Day Post-General Report

Dear Mr. LaBrecque:

You were required to file the 42-Day Post-General Report on December 18, 2018 by 11:59 p.m., but the report was not filed until December 19, 2018. Under the Commission's statutes (21-A M.R.S.A. § 1020-A(4-A)), the late filing of a report triggers an enforcement process. The Commission staff has made a preliminary finding of violation and determined that the preliminary penalty for filing the report late is \$235.03. Please see the next page for the penalty calculation.

You may request that the Commission waive the penalty in whole or in part or find that there was no violation. The request must be made within 14 calendar days of your receipt of this notice. The request must be in writing and contain a full explanation of the reasons the report was filed late. Upon receiving your request, the Commission staff will schedule your request to be heard at an upcoming Commission meeting. You or your designee will have an opportunity to be heard at the meeting or you may submit a sworn statement to the Commission explaining the mitigating circumstances for its consideration.

The Commission may waive or reduce the penalty or find that there was no violation if it determines that the report was late due to mitigating circumstances, which are defined as (1) a valid emergency; (2) an error made by the Commission staff; or (3) relevant evidence that a bona fide effort was made to file the report on time. The Commission may also consider whether the penalty is disproportionate to the size of the candidate's campaign, the level of experience of the candidate, treasurer or campaign staff, or the harm to the public caused by the late disclosure.

The staff requests that you pay the preliminary penalty within 14 days of the date of your receipt of this notice if you do not intend to request a waiver. Please use the payment statement on the next page when paying by mail. You may also make a payment online at <u>www.maine.gov/ethics</u> by clicking the "Penalty Payment" link. Penalty Calculation

The penalty for filing a campaign finance report late is based on a percentage of the total contributions or expenditures for the reporting period, whichever is greater, multiplied by the number of days late. The percentage is based on your history of past violations: 2% for the first violation, 4% for the second violation, and 6% for the third and each subsequent violation. Violations for late-filed reports accumulate in the two-year period beginning on January 1st of each even-numbered year. A penalty accrues daily beginning on the day following the filing due date. Any penalty of less than \$10 is automatically waived.

Close Out Your Campaign & File Early!

File Early. You don't have to wait until the report period closes on December 11th to file your report — you can file early, before the holiday season is upon us. You can file at any time before the deadline when you have:

- ✓ Made all of your expenditures and have paid all of your bills;
- ☑ Made all reimbursements to you and your volunteers and staff;
- ☑ Sold all campaign property and equipment purchased with MCEA funds and entered the amount of the sale proceeds into the report (see inside for more information); and
- ☑ Entered all of your financial transactions into the report (except your return of MCEA funds the Commission staff will enter that).

Amount of MCEA Funds to Return. The cash balance shown on your 42-Day Post-General Report should reconcile with your campaign bank account balance. If it doesn't, <u>return the</u> <u>amount in your campaign bank account rather than the cash</u> <u>balance shown on the report.</u> Please see inside for advice on balance discrepancies.

Return MCEA Funds

Unspent MCEA funds and proceeds from the sale of equipment and property must be returned to the Commission no later then the due date for filing the 42-Day Post-General Report. Sale proceeds – funds the campaign received from the purchaser of the property or equipment – are deposited into the campaign account and are <u>not spent by the campaign</u>.

To return funds, make checks payable to "MCE Fund." You may write a check from the campaign account, or obtain a bank check, for the entire amount remaining in the campaign bank account.

If you want to keep your campaign account open, you may deposit personal funds <u>after</u> MCEA funds are removed.

New E-Filing Site Is Now Live!

The Maine Ethics Commission is pleased to announce a new E-Filing system for campaign finance reporting. We listened to your feedback and have been working closely with the developers to build a site that is user-friendly, modern, and easy to navigate. It was important to us that this next generation site function smoothly, so staff have been testing it extensively to make sure it is ready for our users.

What has changed?

- The biggest changes are to the look and feel of the site. You will still enter transactions
 individually before filing a report, but now, instead of going to different sections for
 Contributions and Expenditures, you'll use the New Transaction button at the top of the page.
- To log into the E-Filing system, click the "Register/Sign-In" button at the top-right. Use the "Sign In" option to enter your user name and password.
- E-Filing will now remind you of your next due reports in an "Immediate To Do" box on your home screen—a handy glance at what's coming upl

What has stayed the same?

- The URL has not changed (<u>www.mainecampaignfinance.com</u>)
- · You keep your existing username and password.
- Only Treasurers are allowed to file the completed financial report; MCEA candidates cannot file the report.

Candidates Defeated in the Primary Election: Closing Out Your Campaign

If you were defeated in a primary, the 42-Day Post-Primary Report is the final report of your campaign. Please remember to:

- pay all of your unpaid obligations by Tuesday, July 17; and
- return all unspent MCEA funds by the time you file your report.

Returning Unspent Funds. If the cash balance shown on your final campaign finance report (Line 7 of Financial Activity Summary) differs from the amount of unspent MCEA funds that you have in your campaign bank account, *return the amount in your bank account*. Please also contact your candidate registrar by email or phone. They will assist you in identifying any reporting error(s). Comparing your bank account statements to the filed reports in the e-filing system may help you in reconciling your balances and in finding reporting errors.

Filing Tip: Get Started Early

You do not have to wait until the filing deadline to enter expenditures into the e-filing system. You can enter them on a weekly or daily basis and avoid a last minute rush. The system will store the information as you enter and save it. Nothing will be available to the public until you actually file the report by clicking the "File Report" button.

You don't have to wait until October 26th to file the report. If you have finished entering all your expenditures, you can file the report anytime before 11:59 p.m. on October 26th.

Filing Tip: Reporting Reimbursements Correctly

When a candidate, campaign worker or volunteer uses their own personal funds (e.g., uses a personal credit card) to pay for goods or services for the campaign, the campaign has to reimburse that person.

To report a reimbursement to a candidate, campaign worker or volunteer, the name of the payee is the **name of the vendor** from which the goods/services were obtained, **not the person** who was reimbursed.

For example, a candidate uses her own credit card to pay Staples for printing flyers. To report the reimbursement correctly, enter Staples as the payee, the amount of the purchase and the date the purchase was made (not the date of the reimbursement). In the explanation for the expenditure, enter "Reimbursed candidate on October 21 for cost of printing flyers."

year. These reports must include all contributions made to and all expenditures made or authorized by or on behalf of the candidate or the treasurer of the candidate as of the end of the preceding month, except those covered by a previous report.

B. Reports must be filed no later than 11:59 p.m. on the 11th day before the date on which an election is held and must be complete as of the 14th day before that date. If a report was not filed under paragraph A, the report required under this paragraph must cover all contributions and expenditures through the 14th day before the election.

C. Any single contribution of \$1,000 or more received or any single expenditure of \$1,000 or more made after the 14th day before any election and more than 24 hours before 11:59 p.m. on the day of any election must be reported within 24 hours of that contribution or expenditure. The candidate or treasurer is not required to include in this report expenditures for overhead expenses or compensation paid to an employee or other member of the campaign staff who has received payments at regular intervals that have been disclosed in previously filed campaign finance reports. As used in this paragraph, "overhead expenses" includes, but is not limited to, rent, utility payments, taxes, insurance premiums or similar administrative expenses.

D. Reports must be filed no later than 11:59 p.m. on the 42nd day after the date on which an election is held and must be complete for the filing period as of the 35th day after that date.

D-1. Reports must be filed no later than 11:59 p.m. on the 42nd day before the date on which a general election is held and must be complete as of the 49th day before that date, except that this report is not required for candidates for municipal office.

E. Unless further reports will be filed in relation to a later election in the same calendar year, the disposition of any surplus or deficit in excess of \$100 shown in the reports described in paragraph D must be reported as provided by this paragraph. The treasurer of a candidate with a surplus or deficit in excess of \$100 shall file reports semiannually with the commission within 15 days following the end of the 2nd and 4th quarters of the State's fiscal year, complete as of the last day of the quarter, until the surplus is disposed of or the deficit is liquidated. The first report under this paragraph is not required until the 15th day of the period beginning at least 90 days from the date of the election. The reports will be considered timely if filed electronically or in person with the commission on that date or postmarked on that date. The reports must set forth any contributions for the purpose of liquidating the deficit, in the same manner as contributions are set forth in other reports required in this section.

F. Reports with respect to a candidate who seeks nomination by petition must be filed on the same dates that reports must be filed by a candidate for the same office who seeks that nomination by primary election.

3-B. Accelerated reporting schedule. (REPEALED)

4. New candidate or nominee. A candidate for nomination or a nominee chosen to fill a vacancy under Chapter 5, subchapter 3 is subject to section 1013-A, subsection 1, except that the candidate shall register the name of a treasurer or political committee and all other information required in section 1013-A, subsection 1, paragraphs A and B within 7 days after the candidate's appointment or at least 6 days before the election, whichever is earlier. The commission shall send notification of this registration requirement and report forms and schedules to the candidate

of perjury, as provided in Title 17 A, section 451, a statement under oath or affirmation whether the expenditure is made in cooperation, consultation or concert with, or at the request or suggestion of, the candidate or an authorized committee or agent of the candidate.

C. A report required by this subsection must be on a form prescribed and prepared by the commission. A person filing this report may use additional pages if necessary, but the pages must be the same size as the pages of the form. The commission may adopt procedures requiring the electronic filing of an independent expenditure report, as long as the commission receives the statement made under oath or affirmation set out in paragraph B by the filing deadline and the commission adopts an exception for persons who lack access to the required technology or the technological ability to file reports electronically. The commission may adopt procedures allowing for the signed statement to be provisionally filed by facsimile or electronic mail, as long as the report is not considered complete without the filing of the original signed statement.

5. Exclusions. An independent expenditure does not include:

A. An expenditure made by a person in cooperation, consultation or concert with, or at the request or suggestion of, a candidate, a candidate's political committee or their agents;

B. A telephone survey that meets generally accepted standards for polling research and that is not conducted for the purpose of changing the voting position of the call recipients or discouraging them from voting;

C. A telephone call naming a clearly identified candidate that identifies an individual's position on a candidate, ballot question or political party for the purpose of encouraging the individual to vote, as long as the call contains no advocacy for or against any candidate; and

D. A voter guide that consists primarily of candidates' responses to surveys and questionnaires and that contains no advocacy for or against any candidate.

21-A § 1020. Failure to file on time (REPEALED)

21-A § 1020-A. Failure to file on time

1. Registration. A candidate that fails to register the name of a candidate, treasurer or political committee with the commission within the time allowed by section 1013-A, subsection 1 may be assessed a forfeiture of \$10. The commission shall determine whether a registration satisfies the requirements for timely filing under section 1013-A, subsection 1.

2. Campaign finance reports. A campaign finance report is not timely filed unless a properly signed or electronically submitted copy of the report, substantially conforming to the disclosure requirements of this subchapter, is received by the commission by 11:59 p.m. on the date it is due. Except as provided in subsection 7, the commission shall determine whether a report satisfies the requirements for timely filing. The commission may waive a penalty in whole or in part if the commission determines that the penalty is disproportionate to the size of the candidate's campaign, the level of experience of the candidate, treasurer or campaign staff or the harm suffered by the public from the late disclosure. The commission may waive the penalty in whole or in part if the commission determines the failure to file a timely report was due to mitigating circumstances. For purposes of this section, "mitigating circumstances" means:

A. A valid emergency determined by the commission, in the interest of the sound administration of justice, to warrant the waiver of the penalty in whole or in part;

B. An error by the commission staff;

C. Failure to receive notice of the filing deadline; or

D. Other circumstances determined by the commission that warrant mitigation of the penalty, based upon relevant evidence presented that a bona fide effort was made to file the report in accordance with the statutory requirements, including, but not limited to, unexplained delays in postal service or interruptions in Internet service.

3. Municipal campaign finance reports. Municipal campaign finance reports must be filed, subject to all the provisions of this subchapter, with the municipal clerk on forms prescribed by the Commission on Governmental Ethics and Election Practices. The municipal clerk shall send any notice of lateness required by subsection 6 and shall notify the commission of any late reports subject to a penalty.

4. Basis for penalties. (REPEALED)

4-A. Basis for penalties. The penalty for late filing of a report required under this subchapter is a percentage of the total contributions or expenditures for the filing period, whichever is greater, multiplied by the number of calendar days late, as follows:

- A. For the first violation, 2%;
- B. For the 2nd violation, 4%; and
- C. For the 3rd and subsequent violations, 6%.

Any penalty of less than \$10 is waived.

Violations accumulate on reports with filing deadlines in a two-year period that begins on January 1st of each even-numbered year. Waiver of a penalty does not nullify the finding of a violation.

A report required to be filed under this subchapter that is sent by certified or registered United States mail and postmarked at least 2 days before the deadline is not subject to penalty.

A registration or report may be provisionally filed by transmission of a facsimile copy of the duly executed report to the commission, as long as the facsimile copy is filed by the applicable deadline and an original of the same report is received by the commission within 5 calendar days thereafter.

5. Maximum penalties. (REPEALED)

5-A. Maximum penalties. Penalties assessed under this subchapter may not exceed:

A. Five thousand dollars for reports required under section 1017, subsection 2, paragraph B, C, D, E or H; section 1017, subsection 3-A, paragraph B, C, D, D-1 or F; and section 1017, subsection 4, except that if the financial activity reported late exceeds \$50,000, the maximum penalty is 100% of the amount reported late;

A-1. Five thousand dollars for reports required under section 1019 B, subsection 4, except that if the financial activity reported late exceeds \$50,000, the maximum penalty is 100% of the amount reported late;
