Cabinet's Community Connections Pilot

- Governor Mills announced federal approval for a \$2.5 million dollars initiative under section 9817 of the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (ARP).
- Development of community-based navigation programming in pilot Lifelong communities and support other innovative programming.
- Key Partners: University of Maine's Center on Aging and Maine's Area Agencies on Aging are key partners.
- Aligning strategies around shared goals.

In continuing to advance Maine state government as an age-friendly, age inclusive place of employment, a statewide training on understanding and addressing ageism and promoting an age-positive culture was offered by to all staff in January 2024.

Preliminary Summary

Over 475 people registered for the 90-minute session Over 275 unique participants watched the live webinar

- ✓ 97% of participants responding to the survey reported that the content was relevant to their work or community.
 - --Majority "strongly agreed" with statement
- √ 94% of participants responding to the survey reported that their knowledge and sensitivity to ageism has increased
