What is energy resilience? The U.S. Department of Energy outlines energy resilience as the ability of the grid, buildings, and communities to anticipate, prepare for, and adapt to changing conditions and withstand, respond to, and recover rapidly from disruptions.

What recommendations did Maine Won't Wait make related to clean energy jobs and businesses? Maine Won't Wait made two primary recommendations on this topic (see page 70):

- Launch a workforce initiative by 2022 that establishes ongoing stakeholder coordination between industry, educational, and training organizations to support current and future workforce needs.
- Establish programs and partnerships by 2022 for clean-tech innovation support to encourage the creation of clean-energy and climate solutions.
