### Enrollment Among Income-Eligible Population



A rating of HIGH or LOW indicates that there is a statistically significant difference between the county's enrollment rate and the state average for enrollment among the estimated income-eligible population. **HIGH** = More of the income-eligible people in the county are enrolled in SNAP, compared to state average. **LOW** = Less income-eligible people are enrolled. **AVERAGE** = Not significantly different than state average for enrollment.
