

Economic Hardship: Households Below the ALICE Threshold

ALICE stands for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed. ALICE households are those who earn above the federal poverty line but still struggle to afford basic necessities like housing, childcare, transportation, and healthcare.

Enrollment Among Income-Eligible Population



A rating of HIGH or LOW indicates that there is a statistically significant difference between the county's enrollment rate and the state average for enrollment among the estimated income-eligible population. HIGH = More of the income-eligible people in the county are enrolled in SNAP, compared to state average. LOW = Less income-eligible people are enrolled. AVERAGE = Not significantly different than state average for enrollment.
