

| <u>LD 1944</u> : clarifies threats to disseminate AI images within framework of revenge porn laws.                                     | JUD   | Enacted, signed law       |
| Artist copyrights  |       |                           |
| <u>LD 109</u> : directs Maine Arts Commission to study protection of artists from AI copyright infringement.                           | EDU   | Enacted, held by Governor |
| Health insurance   |       |                           |
| LD 1301: seeks to regulate the use of AI in health insurance claims.   | HCIFS | Carried over              |
| Campaign advertising   |       |                           |
| LD 1690: sought to require disclosure of Al-manipulated media used in political communications.  | VLA   | Killed in committee*      |
| Social media in schools  |       |                           |
| <u>LD 643</u> : sought to direct DOE to study AI and student use of social media in schools.   | EDU   | Killed in committee       |
| Landlord anti-competitive practices  |       |                           |
| LD 1552: sought to prohibit landlords from using AI to collude in setting rents,   | JUD   | Killed in committee       |
| State procurement  |       |                           |
| <u>LD 872</u> : sought to require OIT to maintain a list of approved AI software for state procurement and ensure public transparency. | SLG   | Killed in committee       |






