



### **OBSERVATIONS**

- Incredible amount of commitment and time contributed by volunteers and staff
- High levels of expertise and knowledge about community needs

- Thoughtful planning that has gone into developing priorities and areas of focus
- Trust of community members

## **EXAMPLES of COMMUNITY FEEDBACK**

- Ensuring state and municipal partners understand value provided by these initiatives
- Identifying ways to meet operational needs not allowed through grant funds (for example, training costs, software)
- Support for volunteer efforts (liability, stipends, costs of background checks)
- Ensuring federal, state, and regional dollars reach down to community-level initiatives ("supplement but not supplant")

## **NEXT STEPS**

- Continue community visits
- Maintain open communication with the Cabinet as a point of entry for information and questions
- Facilitate targeted discussions on key topic areas (volunteer transportation programs, housing)
- Partner on aligning strategies built on our shared goals and vision
