**THIS PERMIT IS SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:**

1. The Permittee must have a valid Maine fishing license.
2. Species not covered by this permit shall be released immediately.
3. Gear and storage containers may be examined by the Maine Warden Service upon request.
4. The harvest report must be returned to Inland Fisheries and Wildlife, 353 Water Street, SHS 41, Augusta, ME 04333-0041.
5. Only four water bodies may be listed on each permit. (The area between dams on a river is considered a single water body).
6. This permit does not give the permittee the right to use fishing gear on private property against the wishes of the property owner. Portions of islands and submerged land immediately surrounding islands in the Penobscot River are part of the Penobscot Indian Nation Reservation, and portions of lands in the St. Croix drainage include portions of the Passamaquoddy Reservation. You must receive permission from tribal authorities and/or appropriate landowner(s) prior to using any gear.
