

The Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife is proposing regulation changes for the upcoming ice fishing and open water fishing seasons. These regulations are needed to provide for the effective conservation of Maine's inland fisheries and to enhance fishing opportunities throughout the State. This rule-making packet includes 12 individual proposals presented in the following "themes":

#### **Regulation Change Description:**

Remove general fishing regulation prohibiting fishing within 150 feet of a fishway, and retain restriction of fishing from within or on the fishway.

#### **Purpose of Change:**

**Description:** This theme includes waters where salmonid size quality, condition, and overall population health has declined or is no longer meeting management goals and objectives, typically associated with populations where reduced angler use, reduced forage, and/or reduced harvest have allowed population growth to exceed carrying capacity and resulting in priority species no longer meet size quality management objectives.

Remove minimum size and daily bag limits on togue under 23 inches and allow for the harvest of only one over 23 inches. In addition, create a fall fishing season with artificial lures only and catch and release on all fish species expect togue.

#### **Purpose of Change:**

Recent biological surveys have documented a decline in the overall health of the popular togue fishery, attributed to an overly robust population and restrictive harvest regulations. Increasing harvest opportunities and expanding seasons will help reduce population density, create new fishing opportunities, and improve the overall health and balance of the fishery. These changes will promote a more sustainable and resilient fishery across all species, while also encouraging angler participation and use of the resource.

Allow ice fishing for smelts from the time ice forms in the fall until April 30th and allow anglers to harvest any fish species for which there is no bag limit while smelt fishing.

#### **Purpose of Change:**

Increase early season fishing opportunity and allow anglers to harvest non-regulated fish species that have no size or bag limit if those fish are caught incidentally while fishing for smelt during the early smelt season. The winter ice fishing season is popular on Cross Lake as the lake regularly forms safe ice early. Opening Cross Lake to an early smelt season would provide additional opportunities close to population centers.

Expand ice fishing season from February only to the B Season (Open to ice fishing and open water fishing from January 1 - April 30). Liberalize togue regulations from the current 1 fish, 23 inches to 2 fish - no harvest between 23-33 inches and only 1 may exceed 33 inches. Remove open water line restriction from 1 line to allow 2 lines (general law).

#### **Purpose of Change:**

In response to declining angler use on Lobster Lake, liberalizing season dates, line restrictions, and togue regulations is proposed. These changes will increase angling opportunities, encourage greater participation, and support continued management of a sustainable, high-quality togue fishery. By expanding access and flexibility for anglers, these regulatory adjustments aim to reverse the downward trend in lake usage while maintaining a healthy togue population.
