

RESTARTING MAINE'S ECONOMY COVID-19 Guide to Reopen Maine Wildlife Park

The State of Maine has adopted a staged approach, supported by science, public health expertise and industry collaboration, to allow Maine businesses to safely open when the time is right. The plan is available at www.maine.gov/covid19/restartingmaine.

The purpose of the COVID-19 Guide is to provide reopening guidelines for the Maine Wildlife Park visitors so they may have a safe and enjoyable visit to the Park.

Phase 2: Maine Wildlife Park Guidelines for Visitors Updated November 6, 2020

- **Reservations are required:** Visitors must make a reservation prior to visiting the park by visiting mainewildlifepark.com
- **Expect limited services:** Programming, tours, shelter reservations and events are not available. The fish hatchery is not open to visitor. Wagon rentals and animal feeders are not available. Picnic tables are available on a first-come, first-serve basis.
- Out of State Visitors: Nonresidents can visit, but only if you have met the state's required guidelines.
- **Restrooms:** Are available and cleaned regularly.
- Stay Home If Not Feeling Well
 - Reservation Cancelation: Visitors should cancel their reservation if they or a member of their family are not feeling well.
 - Do not show up if you are symptomatic or have been symptomatic within 14 days before arrival.
 - Have you had a cough or sore throat?
 - Have you had a fever, or do you feel feverish?
 - Do you have shortness of breath?
 - Do you have a loss of taste or smell?
 - Have you been around anyone exhibiting these symptoms within the past 14 days?
 - Are you living with anyone who is sick or quarantined?
 - Have you been out of state in the last 14 days?
 - If you or a member of your party appear sick, we reserve the right to ask you to leave the park.
- **Practice physical distancing:** Stay at least six feet away from other people who do not live in your household. If necessary, be courteous and step aside when passing other people on the park grounds. Be patient and avoid grouping with other visitors at exhibits. Remember, groups of 10 or more are prohibited.
- **Face coverings:** Visitors are REQUIRED to wear face coverings at all times while visiting the park (except children under the age of two).
- **Don't touch:** Avoid touching signs, kiosks, buildings, fencing, and benches to minimize the potential spread of the virus.
- Pack snacks and water: Do what you can to avoid having to make stops along the way. The snack shack will be open with window service only and during limited days/times. We cannot guarantee the snack shack will be open during your visit due to limited availability of volunteers.
- Watch out for ticks: Wear light-colored pants, closed-toe shoes, and apply EPA-approved bug repellent.
