

Deep Lake is a small, deep lake with exceptionally clear water. Deep Lake was chemically reclaimed in 1957 and 1967 to remove competing species and establish a brook trout fishery. Since reclamation a good trout fishery has existed at Deep Lake with annual stocking of fingerling brook trout. Three new species have become established since reclamation in 1967 probably through illegal introductions or the illegal use of live bait. Prohibition on use or possession of live fish as bait is critical to prevent other introductions of undesirable species.

Access to the pond is by gravel roads. Small boats or canoes must be hand carried to the pond since no boat launch is available.
