Lambert Pond is shallow with a soft mud bottom and an abundant growth of aquatic vegetation. Water temperatures are about equal at all depths. Several good spring areas provide sources of cool water for trout during warm weather. A small trout population exists in the pond; the pond should be managed for its trout fishery.


Sunfish and several species of minnows undoubtedly reduce trout production by competing for available food and space.

The pond is accessible by an unimproved farm road.
