

Physical Characteristics

Area - 121 acres

Maximum depth - 9 feet

Principal fishery: Brook trout

Temperatures:

Surface - 74°F

8 feet - 70°F

Long Pond is shallow with about equal water temperatures from top to bottom in late summer. During hot weather pond temperatures reach the mid-70's and trout seek the cool water of springs and small inlets. Trout production is limited by marginal water quality and by the large populations of suckers and minnows that compete with trout for available food and space.

Tributary spawning areas for trout are limited. The trout population is maintained by spawning within the pond and by movement from the outlet stream.

Access to Long Pond is via the American Realty Road with a short footpath completing the carry in access.
