Beaver Pond is located northeast of White Cap Mountain near the Canadian border. The pond's inlet enters at the western corner of the pond from nearby Little Island Pond and its short outlet flows south into Long Pond and the Kennebago River. The shoreline is lightly developed.

Water quality in Beaver Pond is suitable for coldwater gamefish and a self-sustaining population of brook trout provides a fishery. Growth is slow because a large population of lake chub competes with trout for food and space. The pond is not stocked.

Beaver Pond is not readily accessible to the general public as the access roads are private and gated. The pond is open to fly fishing only in the summer and closed to fishing in the winter months.
