
Sand Pond, located west of Norway/South Paris, provides excellent habitat for coldwater fishes. Brook trout are present in the inlet stream and an occasional larger trout is caught in the pond. Smallmouth bass provide the principal fishery and smelts, minnows and young perch provide ample forage for the bass.

The inlet stream is a popular smelt dipping location in the spring.

Stocking is necessary to improve the quality of the trout fishery, but at the present time there is no public access to the pond. This lack of suitable access precludes any stocking program. Purchasing and developing public access to this pond is a priority of this Department.
