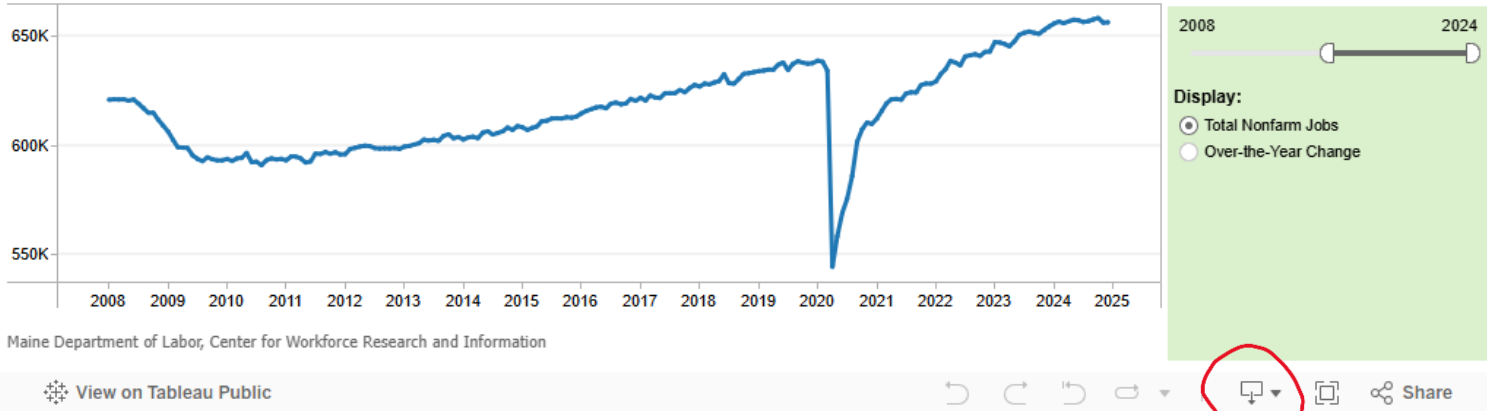
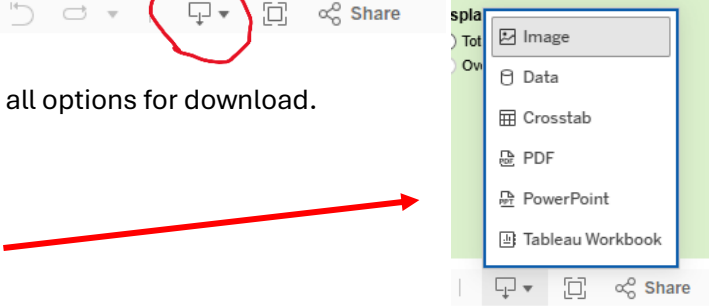


Exporting Data from Tableau Visualizations



- Look for the **download symbol** in the bottom right of the visual, clicking that will display all options for download.
- Any active filters are applied to exported data or images.

If the **crosstab** or **data** options are inactive or greyed out, click on a data point in the visual, and click again to deselect. They will then appear the way the image to the right shows.



Different Download Options:

Image	Data	Crosstab	PDF	PowerPoint	Tableau Workbook
Best when not needing to make changes to interactive and placing into a presentation or document.	Best for viewing data only in a simple table and not needing to use data elsewhere.	Best to directly download data for analysis or make your own visualization.	Best when not needing to make changes to visualization. Can be used to export sheets, dashboards, or workbooks.	Best when multiple tabs or sheets are needed, you do not need to make changes to interactive, and you are placing into a presentation or document.	This feature allows anyone with Tableau to review and extend the analytic work that was behind the original workbook.
Choosing this option allows you to save an entire visual as a BMP, JPG, PNG, or EMF.	Choosing this option will display a web page which shows a table of the data.	Choosing this option allows you to download data as a CSV or Excel file. Each chart or table will need to be chosen and each data set will be exported separately.	This option allows you to choose a variety of layouts. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One or more dashboards or workbooks (if applicable) • Portrait/Landscape 	This option allows you to download the interactive views as a PowerPoint. Different views and sheets must be selected to be included.	If you do not already have a Tableau Desktop Public Edition installed, download the application from the Tableau Public Download page.
