THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Nutting.

Senator NUTTING: Thank you Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. I move that we accept the minority Ought Not to Pass report. I do have a hand out. I didn't realize they were going to start with number 8, but it's being distributed now. so if you would just bear with me for a second. Actually, this is an 11 to 2 report. I voted Ought Not to Pass. I don't feel as though the Secretary of State, who's in charge of running all the elections in the State of Maine, should, themselves, be running for popular election and trying to raise money as they're doing this. What is being distributed is just a copy of a fund raising letter by the person running for Secretary of State in another New England state. That person is in charge of running all the elections for that state and you can see it's a fairly well written campaign fund raising letter, but it's just a little too close for this legislator. So, for those reasons I feel the people that we've had serving as the Maine Secretary of State have done an outstanding job. I cannot recall one instance where their character, or their ability to perform the job, has ever been called into question. So, for those reasons I urge you to support my motion of Ought Not to Pass. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Hancock, Senator Goldthwait.

Senator **GOLDTHWAIT**: Thank you Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. I too, support the minority Ought Not to Pass motion. My reason being that, at this point, when we are doing what we can to try to address issues of campaign finance reform, this would create, yet another statewide election. At this point, with our histories with an election that is of a statewide nature, technology is inevitable. Most citizens in Maine do not have the opportunity to know or meet the candidate firsthand, therefore the election is often run on television, a very expensive medium and we are right into another series of issues that have to do with the amount of money that it takes to get that position, what that means in terms of who is able to run for those positions. And I would urge you to support the minority Ought Not to Pass report.

THE PRESIDENT PRO TEM: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Libby.

Senator LIBBY: Thank you Mr. President, men and women of the Senate. I was on the other side of this issue, and so were 10 other members of the State and Local Government Committee. I think it's important to note that. This is an issue that's been a long time coming. I think we really look forward to having a statewide election for the Secretary of State. I think it takes this position out of the current means of choosing this particular office and, as you know, in prior discussion in this Body, I have indicated that I do not approve of the current means of choosing the Secretary of State or the other constitutional So, with that in mind, and with a great deal of officers proponents coming in front of the State and Local Government Committee, we decided, by a wide majority, to put this question to the people and let them decide and that's exactly what will happen if we pass this legislation. They will first decide whether or not we should do this and then if they do, we will have statewide elections for this office. Thank you for your time.
