Senate January 8, 1992 to March 9, 1992 Under suspension of the Rules, ordered sent down forthwith for concurrence.

Senator **CAHILL** of Sagadahoc was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate on the Record.

Senator CAHILL: Thank you Mr. President. Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate I just want to take a quick moment to thank the Judiciary Committee, Senator Holloway from Lincoln, Senator Berube from Androscoggin, and particularly the Chairman of the Committee, Senator Gauvreau from Androscoggin for what I thought was above and beyond the call of duty in a courtesy that was extended to me yesterday as I presented a Bill regarding Assisted Death of the Terminally III. This is a terribly controversial issue and an emotional issue. It was an issue that at times could have gotten out of control. Thanks to Senator Gauvreau from Androscoggin running of the Committee, I felt I was given every courtesy possible as was every member of the audience that wished to speak about this Bill. Sometimes I don't think we say thank you enough in this Legislature. I really appreciate that courtesy. Thank you.

Senator **GAUVREAU** of Androscoggin was granted unanimous consent to address the Senate off the Record.

Under suspension of the Rules, all matters thus acted upon were ordered sent down forthwith for concurrence.
