House 339: An Act to provide for the semi-monthly payment for cream and milk.

**Passed to Be Engrossed**

Senate 134: An Act in relation to improvement of highways with a road machine or similar device after the 10th day of August in any year.

Senate 124: Resolve, in favor of the Western State Normal school at Gorham for the purchase and installation of equipment for the industrial department.

Senate 161: Resolve appropriating money to repair Mopang bridge in Township No. 30, Middle Division, in Washington county. (Tabled on motion of Mr. Pierce of Houlton pending its second reading and specially assigned for consideration on Thursday of next week.)

Senate 162: Resolve appropriating money to repair the bridges across Northeast Brook and Canoe brook in Township No. 29 in Middle Division, Washington county. (On motion of Mr. Pierce of Houlton tabled pending second reading, and specially assigned for consideration on Thursday of next week.)

Senate 163: Resolve, appropriating money to partially reimburse the town of Deblois for money expended in building a bridge. (Tabled on motion of Mr. Pierce of Houlton pending its second reading, and specially assigned for consideration on Thursday next.)

House 337. Resolve, in the interest of the seed and crop improvement in Maine.

House 338. Resolve, assenting to the provisions of An Act of the Congress of the United States, approved May 8, 1914, entitled "An Act to provide for co-operative agricultural colleges in the several states receiving the benefits of the Act of Congress approved July 2, 1862, and of Act supplementary thereto, and the United States department of agriculture."

House 341. Resolve, making an appropriation for co-operative agricultural work between the College of Agriculture of the University of Maine and the United States department of agriculture.

House 343. Resolve, for further im-

provement in the methods of marketing the farm products and purchasing supplies for the farm.

**Orders of the Day**

Mr. JORDAN of Baileyville: Mr. Speaker, I rise to correct a clerical error in connection with House Document No. 328. Section 8 of this bill says "Nothing in the six preceding sections shall apply" and I would like to substitute for the word "six" the word "seven," so that the section shall read "nothing in the seven preceding sections shall apply."

The SPEAKER: Without objection the correction will be ordered made, and the clerk of the House will be instructed to make the correction.

On motion by Mr. St. Clair of Calais, the vote was reconsidered whereby Senate Document No. 121, bill, An Act to amend Section 21 of Chapter 48 of the Revised Statutes of 1903, as amended by Chapter 69 of the Public Laws of 1907, relating to deposits in savings banks and institutions for savings in the names of married women and minors, was passed to be engrossed, and on further motion by Mr. St. Clair the bill was tabled pending an amendment and specially assigned for consideration on Wednesday of next week.

Mr. Pierce of Houlton moved that the public printer be instructed to print and deliver to the Legislature for its use 500 additional copies of House Document No. 294, bill, An Act to provide for the taxation of interest-bearing deposits in national banks.

The motion was agreed to.

On motion by Mr. Ryder of Brown-
