**THE PRESIDENT**: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Hancock, Senator Damon.

Senator DAMON: Thank you, Madame President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, this amendment that I'm offering is one that is intended to clear up some of the problems that were inherent in the original bill. Essentially some agencies, and I might use the example of the Department of Health and Human Services, need to get information from the Bureau of Motor Vehicles, such as Social Security numbers, and this amendment will allow them to do that. At the same time, it doesn't open it up to all government agencies everywhere to have access to that kind of information. Certainly it does not allow all government agencies to have access to digitized images and signatures that might be available in the databanks of the Bureau of Motor Vehicles. At the same time, it doesn't prevent law enforcement from accessing that kind of information if it is essential to an ongoing investigation. It hopefully clears up some of the inadvertent errors in the original bill. Thank you.
