Committee Amendment "A" (S-9) READ.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Franklin, Senator Gooley.

Senator **GOOLEY**: Thank you, Madame President. I wish to rise and speak in opposition. It's dangerous driving on Maine roads and the use of seatbelts does save lives. This amendment says frequent, and I underline the word frequent, entry and exit from a vehicle to be exempt. That's in the amendment. Frequent is not defined so the whole intent of the bill, with the amendment, is compromised. I urge voting no on this particular legislation.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Plowman.

Senator **PLOWMAN**: Thank you, Madame President. May I pose a question through the Chair?

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator may pose her question.

Senator **PLOWMAN**: Thank you, Madame President. Is this a limited occupational kind of idea or while I'm out campaigning, going door to door, frequently getting in and out of my car, does

THE PRESIDENT: The Senator from Penobscot, Senator Plowman poses a question through the Chair to anyone who may wish to answer. The Chair recognizes the Senator from Hancock, Senator Damon.

Senator **DAMON**: Thank you, Madame President. To the question posed, the amendment to the current law which requires the use of seatbelts is that a newspaper delivery person is not required to be secured in a seatbelt while engaged in the actual delivery of newspapers from a vehicle or is performing newspaper delivery duties that require frequent entry into and exit from a vehicle. To the question that was posed, if the good Senator is employed as a newspaper delivery person while engaged in a campaign it would pertain to her, otherwise it would not.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from York, Senator Sullivan.

Senator **SULLIVAN**: Thank you, Madame President. Men and women of the Senate, indeed this was put in at the request of newspaper carriers, rural carriers, and it follows the exact federal regulations that exempt mail carriers in the rural routes. Some try to lean over and drive this way and the belts don't allow them to do that. It just gets to be a mess. This is the exact same regulation that the National Board of Transportation and Safety has okayed. It is a very limited piece. If you do it in pairs, it is the person who is actually getting in and out of the car, van, or whatever, and not the person that is just driving. That person would have to stay belted up as law. It is the exact same law as the federal regulations for mail carriers. Thank you.

THE PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Schneider.

Senator **SCHNEIDER**: Thank you, Madame President. I'm only standing because I want to go on record as being in opposition to the lack of choice we have in wearing our seatbelts or no. I think the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Plowman, brings up an issue I actually brought up just moments ago about others. What about milk delivery? What about all kinds of things? I don't think we should be penalized for not choosing to wear our seatbelts in cases like that. Whether it is campaigning, milk delivery, or newspaper delivery, I'm against the seatbelt law eliminating our choice to wear or not wear our seatbelt. Thank you.

The Chair ordered a Division. 28 Senators having voted in the affirmative and 5 Senators having voted in the negative, Committee Amendment "A" (S-9) **ADOPTED**.
