First Day

In accordance with House Rule 519, the following items appeared on the Consent Calendar for the First Day:

(S.P. 590) (L.D. 1608) Resolve, To Establish a Study Commission To Study Methods To Improve Ballot Access Committee on **LEGAL AND VETERANS AFFAIRS** reporting **Ought to Pass as Amended by Committee Amendment "A" (S-316)**

(S.P. 593) (L.D. 1611) Bill "An Act To Clarify That Certain Maine Landowner Liability Protection Laws Apply to Abandoned Railroad Corridors" Committee on **JUDICIARY** reporting **Ought to Pass as Amended by Committee Amendment "A" (S-314)**

Under suspension of the rules, Second Day Consent Calendar notification was given.

Emergency Measure

An Act To Reestablish the Milk Handling Fee
(H.P. 996) (L.D. 1432)
(C. "A" H-602)

Reported by the Committee on **Engrossed Bills** as truly and strictly engrossed. This being an emergency measure, a two-thirds vote of all the members elected to the House being necessary, a total was taken. 115 voted in favor of the same and 15 against, and accordingly the Bill was **PASSED TO BE ENACTED**, signed by the Speaker and sent to the Senate.

By unanimous consent, all matters having been acted upon were **ORDERED SENT FORTHWITH**.
