2. CR21-126 Megan McBrady, M.D.

MOTION: The complaint was filed by the sister-in-law of a patient who tragically took their own life. The sister-in-law reported that the patient's toxicology tests showed amphetamines in the patient's system. The physician responded to the complaint and explained her care and treatment. Review of the medical records revealed that the physician's prescribing practices were within the standard of care.

The guidance is as follows: The Board recommends urine toxicology testing for patients receiving any type of controlled substance(s).

MOTION: A patient who presented to the emergency department with stroke-like symptoms alleges the licensee was dismissive of her symptoms, misdiagnosed her and failed to treat her acute stroke. The medical records document that the patient had minimal neurologic symptoms with some facial droop but was not a candidate for tPA and additional stroke workup was recommended. She had difficult IV access and CT angiogram was unable to be performed due to IV infiltration. She was discharged from the emergency department after refusing further workup and presented to another facility the same day and was diagnosed with an acute lacunar stroke. The medical records and responses from nursing staff corroborate the communication with the patient regarding the recommendation for further evaluation. The care of the licensee was felt to be appropriate and within the standard of care.

MOTION: A patient complains failure of the physician and medical practice to provide timely back to work documents caused her unnecessary stress, financial strain and delayed her return to work.

The physician did his best to have the proper forms in order and after returning from vacation, continued to help facilitate the necessary paperwork to have the correct documents in place. The physician named in the complaint was not responsible for the delay in processing the paperwork. There does appear to be a breakdown in communication within the practice including team members and specialists. The physician also noted the office is working on creating a way to process these forms in a more efficient manner and perhaps agency administrative procedures and duties can be reviewed.

7. CR21-152

MOTION: A patient complained this physician refused to see her for an appointment and was not provided an explanation. The patient had been seen by another provider in this practice and the practice sets limits for second opinions within the office to preserve access for all patients. The patient had not only been seen by another provider in this office she had also been seen by another practice on three occasions and the physician named in the complaint concluded the patient was receiving excellent care and she would not have anything to add clinically. This was explained to the patient a number of times by office staff and management.

On the record Dr. Gleaton determined not to recuse herself from the matter based on a request from the licensee.

MOTION: A patient complained that her treating ophthalmologist, who was on vacation and not on call, did not come into an emergency room to treat her for sudden visual loss in her right eye. The patient further complained that had the ophthalmologist seen her and treated her she would not have sustained permanent blindness in that eye. Instead, the patient was seen by an emergency room physician, who was unable to get her seen on a Sunday by any ophthalmologist but had a phone consult with a retinal specialist in southern Maine, who recommended that the patient be seen the next day. Since the licensee was still on vacation, the patient was seen by a local retinal specialist the next day and was cared for appropriately. There is no definitive treatment for the patient's condition except time but appropriate work up for emboli source was accomplished. Furthermore, at the time of the complaint, which was six months after the emergency room visit, the patient's decreased vision was due to several other co-morbid eye diseases.

MOTION: A patient complained that the licensee's office was unreliable in filling medications, which had caused delays resulting in pain and complications. The licensee had only seen the patient once (in 2020) and had provided appropriate care and referral for specialty care. The complainant did not make or keep follow up appointments and appropriate efforts were undertaken to have him seen, while maintaining access to prescription medications. The complainant was dismissed from the practice (with 30-day notice) after communication that was experienced by staff as threatening.

11. CR21-189

MOTION: The spouse of a transitioning transgender patient complains the physician performed an examination without first reading the medical chart and then misgendered her husband. The office interaction appears appropriate and compassionate with the physician conferring alongside colleagues regarding an exam of the genitalia. The patient continued to see the physician after this office visit and the complaint was filed by the spouse over two years beyond this first interaction. Review of the records reveal appropriate care provided.

12. CR21-194

Dr. Waddell moved to dismiss the complaint. Ms. Weinstein seconded the motion.

The patient ultimately indeed transferred her care before the third necessary procedure.

The physician responded to the complaint and explained his care and treatment of the patient, including the patient's involuntary commitment to the health care facility due to unresolved medical issues. Review of the medical records corroborates the physician's response and support his medical decision making and treatment.

14. CR21-206

MOTION: An elderly patient with dementia was admitted to the hospital for a fall with hip fracture for which she underwent orthopedic surgery. The patient had complications including post-operative anemia, acute kidney injury, delirium and failure to thrive. She was treated appropriately with pain medication as needed while being observed for worsening of her delirium. Palliative care was involved to help address goals of care and to optimize the patient's comfort. The family elected for comfort measures and the patient expired on post-op day four. The patient's son alleges that her death was premature and questions her cause

of death and specific etiology for her delirium. Review of the medical records indicates that the patient received appropriate and compassionate care. She unfortunately experienced a decline in her condition following a traumatic injury superimposed on dementia and other comorbidities that often portends a poor overall prognosis. The care rendered by the licensee was appropriate.

Review of the medical records corroborates the physician's response and support her medical decision making and treatment.

24. CR22-79 Ahmad Z. N. Abed Elnoor, M.D.

MOTION: The complaint was filed by a patient who alleged that she felt pressured by the physician to undergo a procedure that he recommended, and after declining the procedure that he accompanied her to the front desk and made an unprofessional statement about her decision not to proceed with the procedure to his staff. The physician responded to the complaint and indicated that he did not recall the discussion at the front desk with staff; however, he did not deny that he made the type of statement alleged by the patient. He stated that he respects his patients and apologized that the patient had a negative experience.

The guidance is as follows: As a physician, it is your professional responsibility to ensure that your communications to patients and about patients to your staff are appropriate and ethical. Inappropriate communication undermines the establishment of an effective physician-patient therapeutic relationship and can lead to patient harm. Dear Mr. Smith,

In accordance with the "Board Member Remote Participation Policy" adopted by the Board on August 10, 2021, I am directing that the August 9, 2022 meeting of the Board be conducted virtually through exclusively remote participation pursuant to Section 2(A) of that policy. In support of this directive, I have determined that, based on the following circumstances, there exists an emergency or urgent issue which, pursuant to the policy, requires the Board to meet by entirely remote methods on August 9, 2022:

- The Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services first proclaimed on January 31, 2020, and most recently renewed on April 16, 2022, the nationwide public health emergency (PHE) due to the continued consequences of the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic. (<u>https://aspr.hhs.gov/legal/PHE/Pages/COVID19-12Apr2022.aspx</u>)
- The Commissioner of the Maine Department of Health and Human Services declared on July 1, 2021 a health emergency due to the continued consequences of the COVID-19 pandemic, which shall remain in effect through the duration of the PHE declared by the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. (<u>https://www.maine.gov/dhhs/sites/maine.gov.dhhs/files/inlinefiles/Public%20Health%20Emergency%20Declaration%206-30-21.pdf</u>)
- 3. The acting Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services wrote a letter to all Governors on January 22, 2021 stating, "To assure you of our commitment to the ongoing response, we have determined that the PHE will likely remain in place for the entirety of 2021, and when a decision is made to terminate the declaration or let it expire, HHS will provide states with 60 days' notice prior to its termination." (https://ccf.georgetown.edu/wp-content/uploads/2021/01/Public-Health-Emergency-Message-to-Governors.pdf)
- 4. Efforts to combat the pandemic continue in Maine where, as of July 26, 2022, 274,500 residents have been infected (197,949 confirmed and 76,551 probable), 5,311 residents have been hospitalized with the virus, and 2,465 people have died from the virus since January 2020. (<u>https://www.maine.gov/dhhs/mecdc/infectious-disease/epi/airborne/coronavirus/data.shtml</u>)
- 5. As of July 26, 2022, the number of new COVID-19 infections in the State of Maine as confirmed by testing brings the seven-day average of new cases in the State to 185; the number of new cases (confirmed and probable) statewide is 1,295; the number of current hospitalizations is 119 (with 17 in critical care); the number of validated vaccine breakthrough cases is 103,338; the total number of deaths is 2,465. (https://www.maine.gov/dhhs/mecdc/infectious-disease/epi/airborne/coronavirus/data.shtml)

- 6. Viruses like SARS-CoV-2 continuously evolve. The Omicron variant of SARS-CoV-2 (including B.1.1.529, BA.1, BA.1.1, BA.2, BA.3, BA.4 and BA.5 lineages) is currently classified as a Variant of Concern. As of July 26, 2022, the Omicron variant represents 100 percent of all sequenced samples collected in Maine.
- 7. As of July 26, 2022, all 16 of Maine's counties are in the "low", 0 counties are in the "medium" and 0 counties are in the "high" transmission category as defined by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
- 8. An in-person meeting of the Board is foreseeably likely to result in an increased risk of exposure to the COVID-19 virus, which has an incubation period of 2-14 days before the onset of symptoms, for members of the Board, its staff, licensees, and members of the public.
- 9. Conducting an in-person Board meeting on August 9, 2022 is not practicable due to the widespread rise in COVID-19 infections and the potential exposure to the COVID-19 virus to Board members and to members of the public. Therefore, I have determined that there is an emergency such that the August 9, 2022 Board meeting shall be held entirely remotely as the best way to protect the safety and wellbeing of the members of the Board, its staff, licensees, and members of the public.

There will be no physical location where members of the public may attend this meeting. The Board will continue to provide members of the public a meaningful opportunity to attend the meeting remotely via Zoom as it has successfully done since April of 2020. Please post this determination to the Board website and update the agenda to include the Zoom information as soon as possible.
