MOTION: This complaint originally came to the board because the licensee is under informal discipline in another state. The case alleged one occasion where the physician assistant worked outside their scope and another where they did not follow the advice of their supervising physician. The licensee is not currently working in Maine. They met with the board of the other state in November 2025, and no additional stipulations were made. The licensee will follow up with the out of state board again in November 2026 and after that she can ask that the stipulation be terminated.

MOTION: The complainant is a patient who was seen in the emergency department for pelvic pain and fever. The patient alleges that the licensee was incompetent in her treatment and failed to diagnose her appropriately. She was diagnosed with a likely viral syndrome and ultimately was admitted the following day for intravenous antibiotics for pelvic inflammatory disease (PID). The licensee responds that she considered the

diagnosis of PID but felt that this was unlikely with no risk factors. The licensee also did not perform a pelvic exam since the patient had just had a pelvic exam the day prior with her primary care provider. She indicates that she did not feel it would have changed management. The licensee reports that the patient improved following treatment, was not septic and was safe to discharge. The medical records indicate that the patient's pelvic exam at the primary care provider's office was abnormal, which would support the diagnosis of PID. The licensee indicates that she has learned from this case and has since diagnosed PID in the emergency department. She answered some additional questions from the Board regarding her decision-making, what she has learned and how she will apply this learning towards her future practice as well as educating others in her training program. Her response was thoughtful and appropriate.

It is essential that licensees are careful about the information and answers provided in applications, know and adhere to the requirements for licensure, and review the license they have been issued. Furthermore, licensees are responsible for practicing only within the scope of their issued license.
