

Jurisprudence Exam – Failing Score

POLICY: It is the policy of the Board of Licensure in Medicine (Board) that applicants for licensure who fail to pass the jurisprudence exam by not attaining a score of 75 or higher based on their initial answer to each question, must retake the exam in paper form. Applicants who fail to pass the exam in paper form on the second try, with a score of 90 or higher, must appear, in person, before the Board.

EFFECTIVE DATE: October 10, 2017

REVISION DATE: January 14, 2025

HISTORY: Board rule allows the Board to have any applicant that fails to pass the exam with a 75 or higher appear for an interview. The Board adopted this policy to allow for a second chance prior to an interview.

The January 14, 2025 revision removed references to the licensure committee.
