MOTION: The Board-issued complaint arose from an expert's review of the physician's medical records which revealed wide-ranging deficits of documentation. The physician responded to a Board request and took a course on Documentation. The physician's report back to the Board about what she learned was reassuring.

The guidance is as follows: Great care should be taken when completing medical records, ensuring thorough documentation which includes criteria-based diagnoses, a history and physical exam supporting those diagnoses, treatment plans, appropriate discussions with the patient and informed consent, and documented rationale when treatment plans vary from the standard of care.

MOTION: The Board-issued complaint arose from a report from a professional review committee that expressed significant concern that the physician had failed to initiate timely or appropriate

treatment for either the patient's diabetic condition or his GI bleed, and concern with her clinical judgement. The Board obtained an independent expert review of the case, and the reviewer's report identified some concerns and opportunities for improvement, but also identified other issues beyond the physician's control that may have contributed to the patient's clinical course.

The guidance is as follows: This case underscores the importance of balancing attention between the primary presenting issue and concurrent metabolic derangements, ensuring that critical findings are not overlooked due to competing acute concerns.

MOTION: The patient's complaint alleged lack of timely management of her complaint of right arm, shoulder, and neck symptoms. The physician's initial response described the general medical care timeline for the patient from October 13, 2024 to November 28, 2024. Board staff inquired further regarding the physician's evaluation of the patient and regarding institutional SOPs for evaluating residents and responding to resident requests for medical evaluation. The physician responded stating that, in his capacity as site medical director, he "...did not personally see the patient..." and he "...reviewed and approved the referral to orthopedics for him and the Nurse Practitioner involved as well as several 'Policy & Procedures' documents. The Board 's review of the medical records and the employment and organizational documents showed that the physician's actions were consistent with the facility's SOP and standard of care. However, documentation gaps were identified in the patient medical records, including unclear assessment, missing progress notes, and vague treatment plans.

The guidance is as follows: Adequate patient medical records include clear documentation of assessments and treatment plans and medical decision-making. Within each practice setting, it is beneficial to have a robust process for documenting patient visits and the medical decision-making process for each patient or patient complaint to enhance transparency and accountability in patient care. In addition, comprehensive responses to Board inquiries are helpful to the Board in appropriately resolving complaints and investigations.

The guidance is as follows: Great care should be taken to verify that each entry in the medical record is accurate and correct, particularly the pre-operative diagnosis. A surgeon is responsible for the accuracy of the documentation even when relying upon ancillary staff to accurately transfer information between documents.

The patient is also concerned that his medical records not be shared. This was updated immediately in the electronic medical record. Additionally, the complainant is concerned about the reporting to the Bureau of Motor Vehicles by the physician assistant. However, the licensee named in the complaint does support the PA. Appropriate care has been provided.

MOTION: A patient's mother took her 12-day-old daughter to the pediatrician to evaluate "watery and gunky eyes." The pediatrician was a locums physician working in his first job as an outpatient attending since completing residency. He confirmed with the patient's mother that the father of the baby had recently been treated for a sexually transmitted infection. Out of an abundance of caution, the pediatrician chose to treat the symptoms with antibiotic eye drops that would cover chlamydial neonatal conjunctivitis. Three weeks after initiating treatment during a visit with a nurse practitioner the mother reported improvement. Eleven months later at the one year well-child visit a watery discharge of the right eye was noted. Ophthalmology evaluation revealed a clogged tear duct. The patient's mother felt that the diagnosis was missed and the presumptive diagnosis of conjunctivitis at the visit was pejorative.

The treating pediatrician responded and explained both his rationale for conservative antibiotics – a desire to not undertreat a potentially significant infection - as well as his inexperience in practicing as a solo locums pediatrician in a small-town environment. He acknowledged that he would likely approach a similar clinical circumstance in a different manner, and he apologized for the mother's discomfiture.
