A. Ian G. Reight, M.D. (CR21-72)

Hearing Officer Rebekah J. Smith, Esq. convened the hearing at 9:03 a.m.

Following deliberation, the Board made the following motions:

Count V. Whether Dr. Reight engaged in unprofessional conduct in violation of 32 M.R.S. § 3282-A(2)(F) by violating a standard of professional behavior established in the practice of medicine by engaging in disruptive behavior meaning aberrant behavior that interferes with or is likely to interfere with the delivery of care by berating and/or intimidating staff working at the Wound Healing and Hyperbaric Oxygen Therapy Clinic ("HBO").

Dr. Waddell moved to find no violation based on the evidence presented. Dr. Ng seconded the motion, which passed 5-2.

Count XIV. Whether Dr. Reight engaged in fraud, deceit, or misrepresentation in obtaining a license or in connection with service rendered within the scope of the license issued in violation of 32 M.R.S. § 3282-A(2) by failing to disclose illicit marijuana use on application(s) to renew his medical license.

Dr Nesin moved to find no violation based on the evidence presented. Dr. Ng seconded the motion which passed 6-1.

Dr. Nesin moved not to grant the motion for directed verdict regarding Counts I, IV, VI, XI and XIII. Dr. Fanjoy seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.

At 11:42 a.m. Dr. Waddell moved to enter executive session pursuant to 1 M.R.S. § 405(6)(F). Dr. Fay-LeBlanc seconded the motion, which passed unanimously.
