Dear Secretary of Transportation,

We are writing to express our strong support for the Maine Department of Transportation's (MaineDOT) application for funding under the FY 2025 Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant program. The proposed project, *Sparking New Life into Maine's Star City*, is an essential initiative to enhance the infrastructure of downtown Presque Isle, ensuring safer and more accessible multimodal transportation for its residents and visitors.
