The Town of Wells is fully committed to matching funds for the 2025 Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD) Discretionary Grant application for the MaineDOT "Route 1 Community Gateway, Implementing a Multimodal Vision for Transportation in Wells, Maine" project.

The Town of Wells supports the proposed MaineDOT project that would improve safety and amenities for active transportation users, while optimizing the mobility and efficiency of motorists along the congested Route 1 corridor. Grant funding would allow the addition of sidewalks, bike lanes, traffic signal hardware upgrades, enhanced crossings, expanded transit stops, pedestrian lighting, and other amenities to maintain or improve operations along the Route 1 corridor. The Town of Wells does not have a typical downtown village, but rather an extensive single corridor of business and residential developments. These proposed transportation improvements and enhancements would increase multimodal connectivity between US Route 1 to the tourist-oriented beach destinations.

The proposed project is a result of a MaineDOT and Town of Wells Planning Partnership Initiative (PPI). The PPI developed a Planning and Feasibility Study to improve the traffic network with a focus on active transportation while fostering economic development. A Roadside Safety Assessment (RSA) was conducted to evaluate safety issues and High Crash Locations (HCLs). The overall study included robust public involvement to gather community input. The benefits of the project will positively impact not only residents and employees but the significant number of tourists and seasonal workers that rely on active transportation to access jobs in Wells.

MaineDOT seeks \$23,703,200 in FY2025 BUILD Discretionary Grant funding which will be matched by \$2,962,900 in MaineDOT funding and \$2,962,900 from the Town of Wells. This project will transform the Route 1 corridor making all modes of transportation safer and more reliable. I urge your favorable consideration for the MaineDOT grant submission.
