## SUMMARY OF THEME SELECTION RESULTS MAY 7, 2013

## Introduction

The theme of a bridge provides inspiration to the engineering design team and links all design elements of the bridge together to create an identity and celebrate the community's sense of place. During the Design Workshop on April 26, 2013, participants were presented with examples of themes chosen by other communities for their bridges and several theme ideas that were further developed from the theme brainstorming during the Stakeholder Meeting held on January 24, 2013. Three theme options were presented: "Eco-Modern Maritime. Sails to Submarines" celebrating the nautical history of the region with the progression of the maritime industry; "Life on the Waterway. Fishing. Lobstering. Recreation." reflecting the importance of the river in the community; and "Unity of Coastal Communities. Nature. River. Strength." developing the commonalities of the communities being linked by the bridge. These are reflected in symbolic images on the banners shown in Figures 1, 2 and 3.

After the presentation, there was time for open discussion and a break for more one on one discussion. The participants were encouraged to discuss among themselves. Large banners were displayed in the room to assist the community in development of ideas. Following the break, the open discussion was continued. Based on the communities' input, five additional ideas for a theme development were written and included in the voting process: Simplicity/Vernacular, Working Waterway, Transition/Gateway, Piscataqua, Sculptural/Iconic.

Some of the direction to the Design Team from the participants included a desire to have the new bridge design be beautiful and simple, and accomplish objectives like:

- Reflect technology of our time
- Be factual (no artificial mimicry)
- Be humble, simple and deliberate
- Be authentic and have purity of materials
- Have nothing that is fake
- No facades or elaborate embellishments


## Summary of Preferences Selected

Voting forms were distributed to the participants, including the three overall themes and the five theme ideas developed during the Design Workshop with the participants. Scoring was done on a scale of 1 to 10, with 10 being the highest possible score. The results of the preferences were: "Simplicity/Vernacular" with an average score of 8.4 and 71.4% of the participants scored this with an 8, 9 or 10; and "Working Waterway" with an average score of 7.1 and 60.7% of the participants scored this with an 8, 9 or 10. The results of the voting preferences are shown in Figure 2.

In combining and summarizing the theme preferences given the community, the result is: Vernacular Simplicity of the Working Waterway. Ecology and Maritime.




Figure 4. Theme Preference Results
