

How To Avoid Disconnection

01

Contact the utility. Find out the minimum amount required to keep the power on. Discuss payment plan options.

- Versant Power: I-855-363-7211

Having trouble affording your bill? Call 2-1-1 to get the phone number for your local Community Action Agency. Ask them about:

02

- The Low Income Assistance Program (LIAP)
- Emergency HEAP funding
- The Energy Crisis Intervention Program (ECIP)
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)

Note: 2-1-1 may also connect you to other local funding resources, such as local churches, veteran's organizations, and others. These resources may also help with other bills.

03

Talk to your utility about the Arrearage Management Program (AMP), which forgives past due amounts as you pay the current amount due on time.

Call your city/town and inquire about General Assistance.

05

If there are children involved, the Maine Office for Family Independence may be able to help (Phone: I-855-797-4357), as well as the McKinney Vento Pilot Program, which is administered through local school districts.
