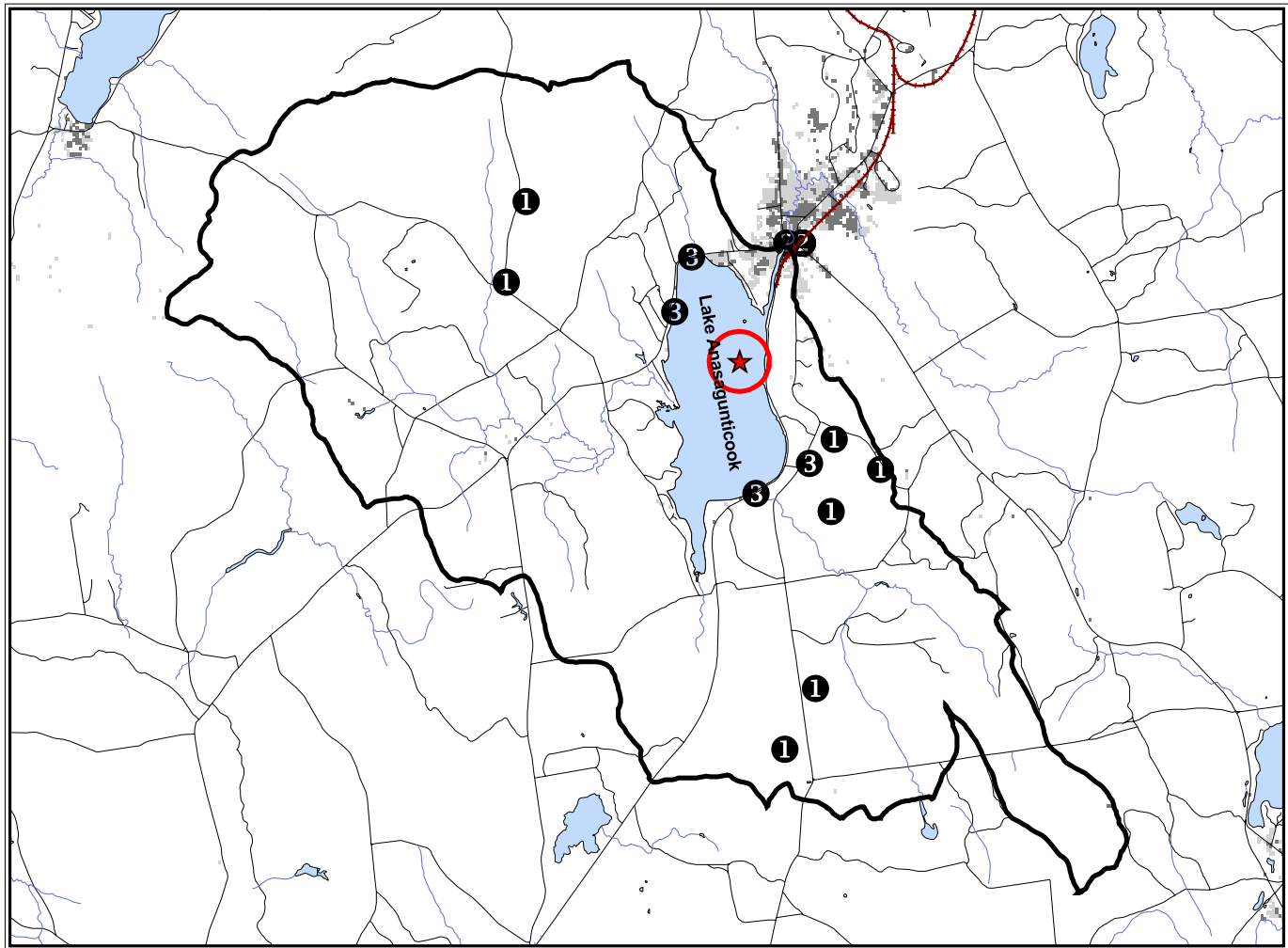




Canton Public Water Supply & Potential Threats to Drinking Water

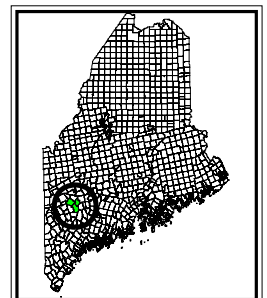
