## Central Maine Library District Annual Report July 1, 2014 — June 30, 2015

### News and Updates

### District

CMLD has 35 librarians enrolled at various levels of the voluntary certification program. So far, they have earned 14 certificates. Back in August, Pittsfield, Hartland and Newport hosted a science fair in Pittsfield that was very well attended by citizens of the 3 towns. Richmond and Canaan opened new buildings and Carrabassett Valley celebrated 5 years in the new building there. Charles Baily in Winthrop has opened a new addition. We're happy to congratulate Betsy Pohl and her staff at the Lithgow Library on the successful bond campaign for an addition to that beautiful building. Among the questions that the consultant received this year were queries about background checks, budget policies, copyright issues, shared services, annual appeals, renovations, ILL, disabling the Internet filter, board vs librarian roles, meeting room policies and patron privacy and law enforcement. The consultant also received a couple of queries from district library patrons about library funding. We've said good bye to several librarians this year: John Clark of Hartland, Mary Farrar of Solon, Charlene Wagoner of Gardner and Barbara Stewart of Kingfield all retired. Melanie Taylor Coombs left Farmington for McArthur in Biddeford. We welcome Mauri Stockford to Farmington, Naomi Homan to South China, Julia Bouwsma to Kingfield and Megan Meyers to Solon.

### Statewide

The consultants and a review committee have produced a new Trustee Handbook based on the Wisconsin model. We implemented a new system for compiling the public library annual report called LibPAS and Jenny and Stephanie conducted 4 face to face and 1 virtual training sessions on data input and the report features of this new system which are quite robust. The state library successfully submitted an IMLS Leadership Grant with Cornerstones of Science and the CMLD consultant is involved with that project which will involve 6 libraries in Maine and Massachusetts as well as input from 3 other state library agencies. The SCOOP contract will involve Maine, New Hampshire and all of Vermont when the new period begins in July, 2015. The consultants are working with counterparts in the other 2 states to put the catalog together. We sponsored a readers' advisory webinar series with Becky Spratford that concluded in early April. Statewide, there are 132 librarians enrolled in the certification program and 73 certificates have been issued. The state library was quite involved with the joint MLA/MASL conference in November and the consultant took part in presentations on LibPAS, ILEAD and the Maine Library Leadership Institute.

### **National**

The state library is excited to be partnering with 9 other states to bring ILEAD (Innovative Libraries Explore, Apply and Discover) to Maine. We have 4 teams of awesome librarians participating and working on some exciting projects. The CMLD consultant and the Library Development Director are both involved in a national Continuing Education initiative that is designing a 4 part webinar series for new directors.
