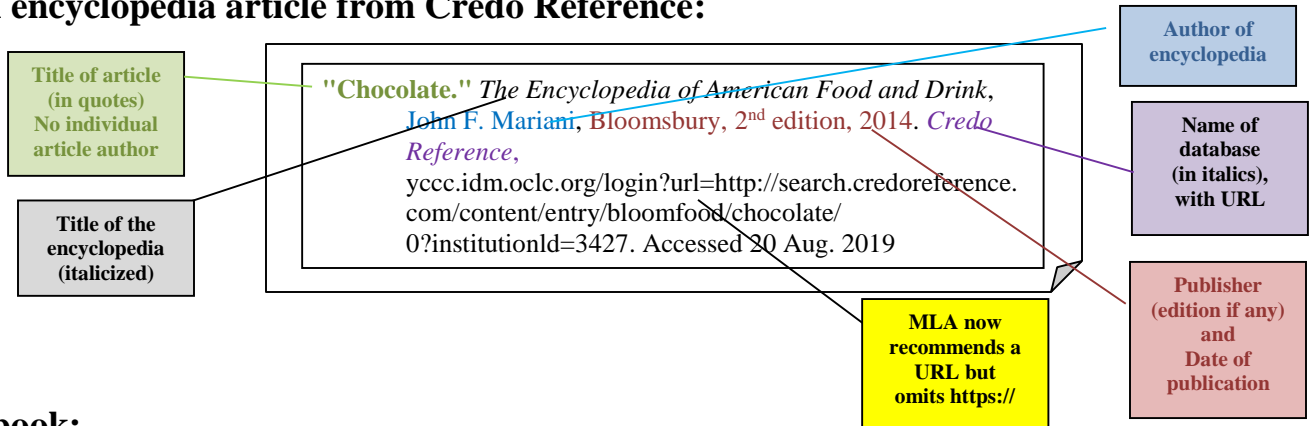


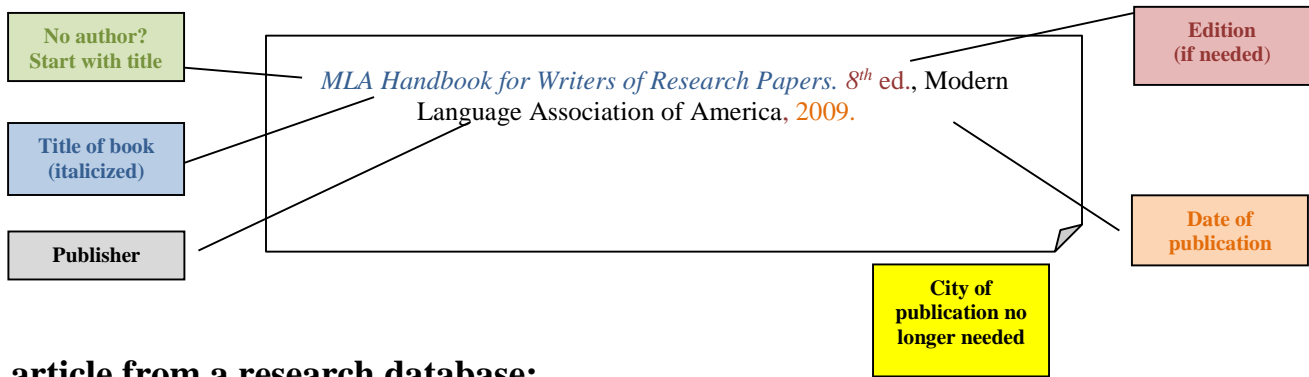

Tip: pay close attention to punctuation

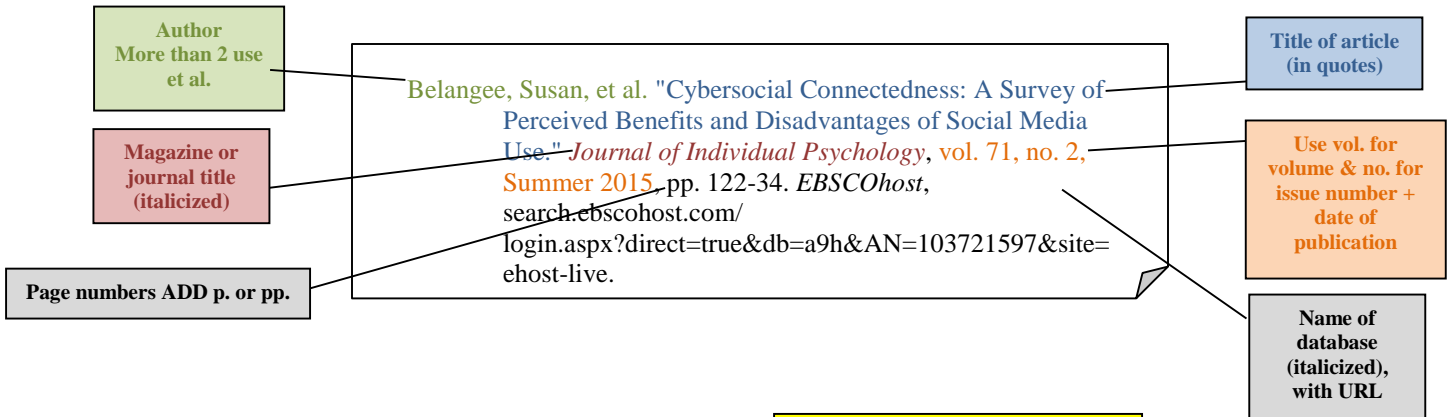

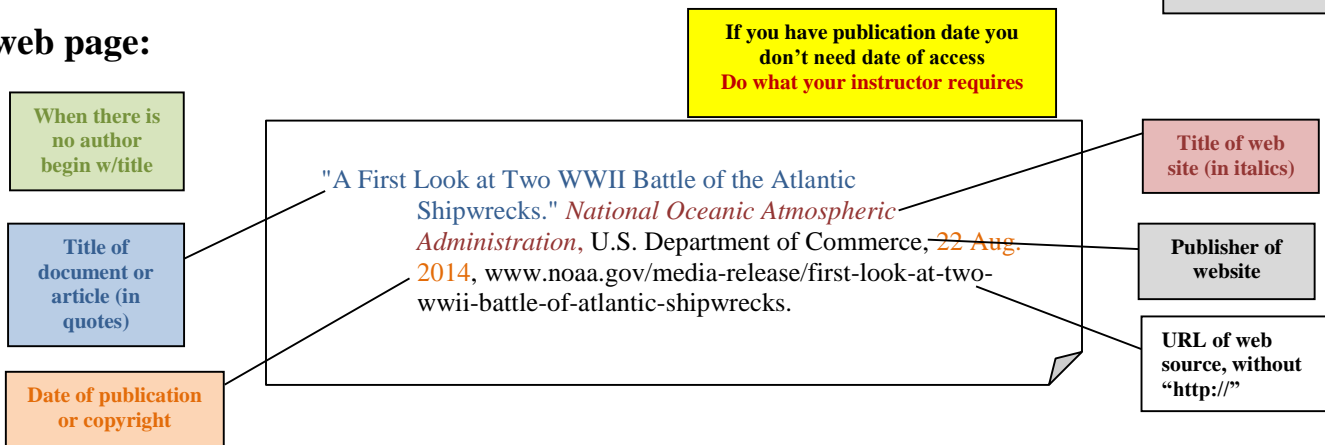
