
Counting Electronic Materials

Is user authentication required to access the electronic material?



Do not count.

(e.g., Librivox, Project Gutenberg)

This is a database.

Electronic materials that are ondemand and Do NOT have a loan period or access for a set amount of time, meet the definition of a database.

Examples: Freegal, Tumblebooks, cloudLibrary NewsStand

<u>Collection</u>: 5.11 Local/Other Cooperative Agreements

<u>Usage</u>: 6.7 Successful Retrieval of

Electronic Information

Does the material have a loan period or access for a set amount of time?

Yes



What is the payment/ownership model?

Pay-Per-Unit/Item

<u>Collection</u> = Count ALL units as part of the collection, whether purchased, licensed or leased

- 5.4 Electronic Books
- 5.6 Audio Downloadable Units
- 5.8 Video Downloadable Units

Pay-Per-Use

<u>Collection</u> = Do not count the entire catalog. Include only CIRCULATED items as part of the collection

- 1 circulation = 1 holding
- 5.4 Electronic Books
- 5.6 Audio Downloadable Units
- 5.8 Video Downloadable Units

What Goes Where

Examples: Downloadable audiobooks and Ebooks from Libbby and coudLibrary, Hoopla

Expenditure: 3.15 Electronic Materials Expenditure

Collection: 5.4 eBooks, 5.6 Audio-Downloadable Units, 5.8 Video-Downloadable Units

Usage: 6.2 Children's/YA Electronic Material Use and 6.5 Adult Electronic Material Use
