RECENTLY RELEASED SPENDING REPORTS:

Over the last few months, several states have released spending reports that provide helpful inspiration for future OAHC annual reports. Three of the most robust are:

- Delaware <u>Benchmark Trend Report Calendar Year 2022 Results</u>
- Massachusetts <u>Performance of the Massachusetts Health Care System March</u> 2024 <u>Annual Report</u>
- Rhode Island <u>Annual Report 2024 Health Care Spending and Quality in Rhode Island</u>

Note – most states reporting on spending are doing so within the structure of cost growth target programs, but many of the reporting elements and visualizations do not require a cost growth target to replicate
